# Contacting Your Representative

# Find My Legislator is telling me I'm in a different district than I remember being in. What happened?

California went through redistricting in 2021, a process that takes place once every ten years. During this process, district lines can shift, which might change who your representative is.

#### My district doesn't have a representative. Why is that?

There are currently vacancies in both the State Assembly and Senate b. If your district is currently vacant, there will be a special election to select a new representative.

#### If there is a vacancy in my district, who should I email or call?

If there is a vacancy in your district, you can call another representative who represents your school district or community. You can also call any members of the Senate or Assembly Education Committee, indicated by a + next to their name.

#### I've never called my representative before. What should I expect?

Calling your representative is an easy process! You will be connected to your representative's office and speak with one of their staff members. You can use the sample script we provided either through Action Network or in this toolkit to help guide your conversation. You will also be able to leave a message if you aren't able to connect with a staffer. If you're feeling nervous, you can practice the script a few times before you make the call!
