- Open your Yeni Istanbul A2 coursebook and look at the Hazırlık Çalışması on pg. 8. Answer the questions.
- Study the verbs listed under the cooking photos and match each verb with the correct food item. Say the verb and food item out loud as a short command (e.g., "Eti doğra!").
- Complete activity 4 by matching the words with quantities and containers on pg. 8. Say each full phrase aloud.
- Read the Manti Yapalim recipe on pg. 8 out loud. Underline all verbs. Notice how many verbs are in the imperative form.
- Sequence the recipe photos for activity 5 on pg. 9. Say what's happening in each one.
- **HAND IN:** Write a short recipe (6–8 steps) for a dish you know (real or imagined). Use at least 5 imperative verbs. Use vocabulary from the book and try to include at least 4 steps in each. Feel free to keep it simple, or add a sentence or two at the beginning like "Benim yemeğim çok lezzetli!" or "Bu tarif annemden." etc.
- Study the grammar table on pg. 9. Say the positive and negative forms out loud. Pay attention to vowel harmony and formal/informal endings.

- Watch the LangMedia video on <u>Imperatives</u>. Take notes of your questions to ask during your tutorial.
- Turn to Yeni Istanbul pg. 10 and complete activities 6-7 and fill in the blanks with the correct imperative forms. Read each sentence aloud after completing it.
- Look at Dr. Mehmet Öz's 7 Golden Tips (pg. 10, Activity 7). Say each one aloud with the correct verb.
- Look at the 6 images below. For each one, write a health-related suggestion using the imperative.
- **HAND IN:** Write a dialogue (6–8 lines) between two people giving each other advice or instructions. One person can be a parent, teacher, friend, doctor, or coach. Use at least 4 different imperative verbs. Include greetings and polite forms.
- Turn to Yeni Istanbul pg. 11. Study the traffic signs and their meanings. Say each one out loud.
- Listen to the dialogue in Activity 11. Try to fill in the blanks while listening. Then read the whole dialogue aloud in front of a mirror.
- HAND IN: Write a dialogue (8–10 lines) where someone gives directions to a
 friend trying to get to a location (e.g., market, gym, school). Include at least 5
 direction phrases as well as greetings, partings and common expressions like
 "affedersiniz", "teşekkürler", etc. Make sure to use the appropriate
 formal/informal tone consistently throughout the dialogue.
- Turn to Yeni Istanbul pg. 12. Look at Activity 13. Follow the image sequence and write simple steps for cooking pasta. Use imperative forms and kitchen vocabulary you just learned.
- Then complete activity 14 by writing a pasta sauce recipe. List ingredients and write 3–4 steps for preparation.
- Open your Yeni Istanbul A2 workbook and complete activities 1-7 on pp. 4-5.

- Be prepared to warm up by performing two activities:
 - Asking and answering questions about your favorite food and how it's made.
 - Taking turns making up minor problems ("My friend isn't talking to me for some reason", "I'm short on money"), and the other person provides a solution.
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you are in a cooking class in Izmir. Your conversation partner, roleplaying the teacher, will pick a simple

- dish with illustrations, then lead you through the recipe step by step. Ask questions to confirm the instructions. You may switch roles and do the same with other recipes.
- Be prepared to perform two roleplays in which you are:
 - An American giving directions and help to a Turkish person in a community you know. They are lost and need a place to stay the night, food, etc.
 - Asking for the same help from a Turkish person on the street in Istanbul.

- **HAND IN:** Write a short recipe (6–8 steps) for a dish you know (real or imagined). Use at least 5 imperative verbs. Use vocabulary from the book and try to include at least 4 steps in each. Feel free to keep it simple, or add a sentence or two at the beginning like "Benim yemeğim çok lezzetli!" or "Bu tarif annemden." etc.
- **HAND IN:** Write a dialogue (6–8 lines) between two people giving each other advice or instructions. One person can be a parent, teacher, friend, doctor, or coach. Use at least 4 different imperative verbs. Include greetings and polite forms.
- **HAND IN:** Write a dialogue (8–10 lines) where someone gives directions to a friend trying to get to a location (e.g., market, gym, school). Include at least 5 direction phrases as well as greetings, partings and common expressions like "affedersiniz", "teşekkürler", etc. Make sure to use the appropriate formal/informal tone consistently throughout the dialogue.

- Read the dialogue Yemek Siparişi on pg. 13 aloud. Notice how they order food, make suggestions and respond politely.
- Complete the comprehension questions in Activity 2. Mark each one D (doğru) or Y (yanlış).
- Study the grammar chart on pg. 14 explaining İstek Kipi (Optative Mood). Practice reading all forms aloud. Pay attention to which subjects are used and which are not.
- Complete activity 3 on pg. 14. Use the model sentence to complete each line with an appropriate optative suggestion.
- On pg. 15, complete Activity 4. Create sentences from the jumbled words. Say each sentence out loud after writing it.
- In activity 5, practice giving responses to common everyday problems. Fill in the blanks with either imperatives or suggestions.
- In activity 6, fill in the blanks in the dialogue between Demet and Gül using imperative and optative forms. Read the full dialogue aloud for fluency practice.

- **HAND IN:** Write a dialogue (6–8 lines) between two friends making weekend plans. Use at least 3 optative forms and 3 imperative forms. Include at least one suggestion your partner rejects or modifies.
- Turn to the listening section on pg. 16 (Activity 7). Listen to the audio and complete the dialogue about vacation plans.
- Then read the completed text and match each person with their destination in Activity 8.
- Complete the writing prompt in Activity 9. Write at least 4–5 vacation suggestions using the optative mood.
- **HAND IN:** Look at the writing activity on pg. 16, Activity 10. Write a waiter-customer dialogue (at least 10 lines) using the sample café menu. Use the image of the menu for specific items and prices. Incorporate at least two different drink or food items from the list. Your dialogue should include a polite greeting and opening line from the customer, a question or request to see the menu, an order placed by the customer, a confirming line or suggestion from the waiter, and a closing phrase for when the interaction ends. Make sure each speaker has at least 4 turns.
- HAND IN: Write a vacation plan paragraph using the chart in Activity 11 on pg. 16. Use the questions in the table as a writing prompt. - Open your Yeni Istanbul A2 workbook and complete exercises 1-8 on pp. 6-8.

- Be prepared to warm up with an activity in which you and your classmates imagine you want to hang out on the weekend. Make up a plan, place, and time.
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you attend a traditional Turkish restaurant. Your conversation partner will explain some facts about traditional dishes, etiquette, etc. They will also bring a menu of a kind to work with. Order food from them as a waiter, then try to switch roles.
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you want to eat popular street food and are wandering with a Turkish friend. Your conversation partner will identify some popular street foods and show you what these places look like. You order food, asking about prices as you are able, then switch roles.

• Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you and a friend in Istanbul want to go on a tour of a European country during a long weekend off. Make plans regarding: where, how long, what type of transport to use, etc.

- **HAND IN:** Write a dialogue (6–8 lines) between two friends making weekend plans. Use at least 3 optative forms and 3 imperative forms. Include at least one suggestion your partner rejects or modifies.
- **HAND IN:** Look at the writing activity on pg. 16, Activity 10. Write a waiter-customer dialogue (at least 10 lines) using the sample café menu. Use the image of the menu for specific items and prices. Incorporate at least two different drink or food items from the list. Your dialogue should include a polite greeting and opening line from the customer, a question or request to see the menu, an order placed by the customer, a confirming line or suggestion from the waiter, and a closing phrase for when the interaction ends. Make sure each speaker has at least 4 turns.

- Open your Yeni Istanbul A2 coursebook and start with the questions in the Hazırlık Çalışması (pg. 17). Think about how you use the internet and social media. Say your answers out loud. Jot down 3 pros and 3 cons of social media in Turkish. Use simple phrases if needed.
- Read the profile texts in the reading section. Pay attention to how people describe themselves using adjectives and physical traits. Underline or highlight all physical and personality traits.
- Do activity 4 and match the texts with the photos and write down the correct names and physical features. Say your answers aloud.
- Do activity 5 and choose the personality adjectives that best describe Merve, Hakan, and Nesrin. Practice saying full sentences.
- Study the grammar explanations on pp. 18–19. Practice saying the example out loud.
 - o Focus on how -li / -siz change a noun into an adjective.
 - Notice how -lik / -lik create abstract nouns and fields of work.
- Do activity 6 and add the correct suffixes to the word stems. Read the words out loud and pay attention to vowel harmony.
- Do activity 7 and complete the sentences with appropriate suffixes based on context.

- Do activity 8 and match each adjective with its opposite meaning. Say both forms aloud.
- **HAND IN:** Write an advertisement (5–7 sentences) for a new product or invention. You can invent anything: a food or drink, a cleaning product, an electronic device, a beauty product, a school supply or even something imaginary! Be creative. Your ad must include at least 3 words with -lı, -sız, or -lık suffixes, a product name or brand, one feature or benefit of the product, and one sentence with a command or suggestion, using either the imperative or optative.
 - Example (Basic): Şekersiz Tatlılar artık raflarda! Katkısız, yağsız ve çok lezzetli. Bu sağlıklı atıştırmalıklar tam size göre. Hemen deneyin!
 - Example (Creative): Yeni Gözlükmatik 3000 burada! Işıklı ekranı, çiziksiz camı ve katlanabilirlik özelliği ile harika bir deneyim sunar. Her ortamda rahat kullanım sağlar. Hadi gözlük sorununu birlikte çözelim!
- Do the listening activity on pg. 20 (Activity 9). Listen to the audio and fill in the blanks. Then read the completed dialogue out loud for fluency practice.
- Do activity 10 and look at the pictures and write sentences describing each person's physical appearance. Say each sentence aloud.
- Do activity 11 and choose a real or imaginary friend and describe them using the questions in the speaking task. Practice both asking and answering the questions.
- **HAND IN:** Write a paragraph (5–6 sentences) describing a person you admire (real or imaginary). Mention at least 3 physical traits and at least 3 personality traits. Try to include at least 2 -li or -siz adjectives and 1 -lik or -lik noun.
- **HAND IN:** Write a dialogue (6–8 lines) between two people meeting on a friendship or dating site. They should introduce themselves and describe their appearance, personality, and job/study field. Use at least 3 descriptive suffixes and remember to include greetings and partings.
- Open your Yeni Istanbul workbook and complete exercises 1-5 on pp. 9-10.

- Be prepared to warm up by looking at pictures of objects and people and asking and answering questions about their appearance. You may also make a guess about their personality.
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you are supporting a different candidate for Istanbul city council than a friend. At one of your apartment's

- one evening, you try to (nicely) persuade one another to vote for your candidate by describing who they are, what they're like, and so on.
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay/activity with the following steps:
- Brainstorm an ad in Turkish that you might see on Instagram in Tiktok, for a product you like.
- Once you have notes and have discussed, perform the ad as if you were shooting it for social media.
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which one person is a big fan of a novel/TV show and telling their interested friend about it. They describe characters, events, and so on to make their case. The interested friend asks some questions. Switch roles and repeat.

- **HAND IN:** Write an advertisement (5–7 sentences) for a new product or invention. You can invent anything: a food or drink, a cleaning product, an electronic device, a beauty product, a school supply or even something imaginary! Be creative. - Open your Yeni Istanbul A2 coursebook and look at the Hazırlık Çalışması on pg. 28. Answer the questions about important events in your life. Say your answers out loud.
- Match the phrases (a–i) with the photos (1–9) in Activity 2. Say each life event out loud.
- Read the reading passage "Küçük Hayatlar, Büyük Başarılar." Highlight key life events in each person's biography.
- Answer the comprehension questions in activity 3 (pg. 29) by filling in the blanks according to the text. Say each sentence aloud for fluency.
- **HAND IN:** Answer the question in "Ya Siz?" by reflecting on your own biggest accomplishment in a short paragraph (5-7 sentences). Think of one major event or achievement in your life. Use the -DI past tense to describe what you did. Mention when it happened. Say your paragraph out loud for practice before submitting.
- Study the grammar chart on pg. 29 explaining the Simple Past Tense (-DI).
 Practice reading all conjugated forms aloud.
- Read the example sentences and note how time expressions are used.
- Watch the LangMedia video on <u>Definite Past Tense with Verbs</u> to reinforce what you've learned. Write 5 sentences of your own using the past tense -DI.

- Turn back to Yeni Istanbul A2 and complete Activity 4 on pg. 29 by filling in the blanks with the correct verb forms. Read each sentence aloud.
- Complete activity 5 on pg. 29 by selecting the sentences that describe your past weekend. Say each one out loud.
- HAND IN: Write a paragraph (6-7 sentences) about what you did last weekend, last summer or during a recent holiday. Use verbs in the -DI simple past tense to narrate what you did. Include at least 3 different activities.
 Mention places you went or stayed, people you were with, or how you felt.
 Add time expressions.
- Complete the listening task in Activity 6 on pg. 30. Listen and fill in the blanks about the lives of famous people. Then reread the completed passage aloud.
- Do the speaking task in Activity 7. Look at the photos of famous people. Practice answering the questions in full sentences.
- Do activity 8 by answering the questions and writing your answers down. Practice talking about famous people's lives and achievements.
- HAND IN: Choose one of the people in the speaking part and write a mini biography of them. Begin with where and when the person was born.
 Mention what they are famous for. Include at least 2 important life events.
 Use -DI tense to describe past achievements. Use specific time markers if known. Keep your sentences simple and focused.
- Complete the timeline in Activity 9 by filling in the missing details. Then read the paragraph aloud.
- Complete Activity 10 by creating your own life timeline. Use at least 6 life events and write short descriptions for each.
- HAND IN: Turn your life timeline into a mini autobiography (8-10 sentences) using -DI past tense. Include at least 6 key events in your life and use at least 3 different time expressions. Use -DI past tense to describe at least 6 events from your life. Include 3 different time expressions. Begin with your birth and move forward chronologically. You can include life events like starting school, moving to a new city, learning something new, graduating, starting a job, or traveling.
- Open your Yeni Istanbul workbook and complete activities 1-7 on pp. 11-12.

 Be prepared to warm up by asking and answering questions about different parts of your life - childhood, high school, earlier in college, and so on. If any of this is sensitive, feel free to make something up or talk about a different time in your life.

- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you are interviewing for a job at an NGO focused on introducing renewable energy in Istanbul. Answer all of the questions, and try to give any relevant experience to advocate for yourself. Your conversation partner may choose a different job than the one suggested here, based on your interests.
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you are a Turkish person coming home from a year abroad in the US and are catching up with an older relative. They are very curious about everything you are doing!
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you are meeting with your friends in a Turkish university after being on summer vacation. Greet one another and start the conversation properly. Then ask and share about what you did in the summer - either making things up, or relying on your own experiences.

- **HAND IN:** Answer the question in "Ya Siz?" by reflecting on your own biggest accomplishment in a short paragraph (5-7 sentences). Think of one major event or achievement in your life. Use the -DI past tense to describe what you did. Mention when it happened. Say your paragraph out loud for practice before submitting.
- HAND IN: Write a paragraph (6-7 sentences) about what you did last weekend, last summer or during a recent holiday. Use verbs in the -DI simple past tense to narrate what you did. Include at least 3 different activities.
 Mention places you went or stayed, people you were with, or how you felt.
 Add time expressions.

- Open your Yeni Istanbul A2 course book to pg. 31. In the Hazırlık Çalışması, talk about your movie habits. Answer the questions out loud: How often do you go to the cinema? What kind of movies do you like? What was the last movie you watched?
- Look at the movie posters and the genre labels. Say each film's genre out loud and try to use full sentences.
- Read the dialogue "Sinemada Hangi Film Vardı?" on pg. 31. Pay attention to how past tense is used in informal conversation.
- Answer the comprehension questions in Activity 3 on pg. 32. Read each question out loud and answer in full sentences.
- **HAND IN:** Write a dialogue (10–12 lines) between two friends talking about a movie they watched. Mention movie title, plot summary, lead actors, opinions and whether they recommend it or not.
- Study the grammar chart on pg. 32 for Simple Past Tense with nouns/adjectives. Practice saying the full chart aloud.
- Read the example sentences and underline time markers.

- Watch the LangMedia video on <u>Definite Past Tense without a Verb</u> to reinforce what you've learned. Write 5 sentences of your own using the past tense -DI.
- Turn back to your Yeni Istanbul course book and complete Activity 4 by filling in the blanks with appropriate forms like hastaydı, yorgundum, mutlu değildi etc. Say each sentence aloud after completing it.
- Complete activity 5 on pg. 33 by asking and answering about Leyla's vacation.
 Practice forming both questions and answers. Say the questions and responses out loud.
- Study the conjunctions box on pg. 33: çünkü, bu yüzden, bu nedenle, bunun için. Read the examples and notice the relationship between clauses.
- Do activity 6 by completing the blanks with the correct conjunction. Then say the completed sentences out loud.
- Do activity 7 and write 5 cause-effect sentences using the phrases. Practice saying the full sentences and focus on correct intonation.
- **HAND IN:** Write a cause-effect paragraph (6–8 sentences) using at least 4 different connectors from the grammar section (çünkü, bu yüzden, bu nedenle, bunun için). You can write about a past event, such as being sick, having a bad/good weekend, or missing school/work.
- Do the listening activity in Activity 8 on pg. 34. Fill in the blanks as you listen. Then, read the full dialogue out loud. Practice reading both parts.
- Answer the questions in Activity 9 on pg. 34 based on the listening dialogue.
 Practice forming answers aloud and repeating key words from the question.
- Read the blog writing prompt on pg. 35. Read Daniela's post and the follow-up questions.
- **HAND IN:** Write your own short travel blog about a recent trip or imaginary vacation. Use the questions in Daniela's post to guide your blog. Write at least 8–10 sentences, using a variety of past tense verbs and time expressions.
- Open your Yeni Istanbul workbook and complete exercises 1-6 on pp. 13-14.

- Be prepared to warm up by asking and answering questions about the last weekend, recent holidays, and other past events.
- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you come to a class with a strict professor after you missed the last lecture unannounced. The professor wants an explanation for why. Switch roles and repeat.

- Be prepared to perform a roleplay in which you are giving an orientation for Turkish students coming to study at your institution. You need to describe student life, what people do for fun, how time is spent, what the food is like. The "Turkish" students will then ask you questions. This may be repeated with a rotation of roles.
- Be prepared to perform one activity and one roleplay:
 - Activity: Cooperate in Turkish to write a short script for a TikTok or other reel-style video about an amazing travel destination that you have just traveled to.
 - Roleplay: Assign lines to classmates and your conversation partner, and perform the script.

- **HAND IN:** Write a dialogue (10–12 lines) between two friends talking about a movie they watched. Mention movie title, plot summary, lead actors, opinions and whether they recommend it or not.

- LangMedia Turkish Collection: <u>The Postposition "ile"</u>

- Open your coursebook to pg. 36 and start with the Hazırlık Çalışması section.
 Match the images with the news topics. Say your answers out loud and discuss your reasoning.
- **HAND IN:** Write a paragraph (5–6 sentences) about your news habits. What topics are you most interested in? Do you watch or read the news? In which language(s)? Why or why not?
- Read the text titled "Sağlıklı Bir Hayat İçin On Altın Kural" on pg. 36. Highlight any new words related to health, food or habits. Underline useful advice or surprising tips.
- Say each of the 10 rules out loud, paying attention to pronunciation.
- Complete the comprehension questions in Activity 4 (pg. 37). Write your answers in full sentences and read them out loud.
- Do activity 5 and mark each statement as true (D) or false (Y). Say the correct versions of any false sentences out loud to self-correct.
- Study the grammar box on pg. 37 about the word "ile". Note its different functions: "with," "by means of," "and/along with." Read the sample sentences out loud.
- Watch the LangMedia video about the <u>postposition "ile"</u> and take notes. Is everything clear? If not, bring your questions to your tutorial!

- Do activity 6 and fill in the blanks with ile. Pay attention to whether ile is used as a separate word or as the suffix -le / -la. Say your completed sentences out loud for fluency.
