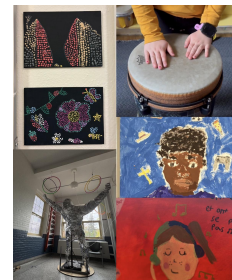

As the end of the school year approaches, we are planning for the 2026/2027 school year. The teaching staff and Admin Team will be holding placement and promotion meetings for students in the coming weeks.

The process of building our classes includes a consideration of balance in the following areas:

- Students' abilities, strengths and achievement levels
- Students' needs and learning styles
- Students' interaction patterns that enable them to learn together productively

We consider all factors that will help us to have balanced classes that adhere to system average class sizes and ministry caps in primary (grades 1-3) that will work to the benefit of all students, and the school as a whole.

We would like to welcome input from parents as to the unique needs of your child. If you wish to provide input regarding your child (i.e., learning style, academic needs, social/ emotional considerations), please do so on the form below and submit it by **May 19, 2026, at 8:00 am.**

This input will inform a decision but not guarantee a specific placement.

It is important to note that **we are not asking for, nor can we accept, requests for placement with a specific teacher.** In addition, the ultimate responsibility of placement lies with the Principal.

Class placements for 26/27 will be shared with families on September 4, 2026.

Caring and Safe Schools: Road Safety

Active school travel (walking, biking, scootering) is a great way to stay healthy, reduce car traffic, and ignite our brains for learning.

We're happy to see that with the warmer weather, more and more of our students are building activity into their commute to school.

The Toronto Public Health [SAFETY GUIDE FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN & PARENTS](#) reviews several safety tips that are written and illustrated in a child-friendly way. We encourage families to review the tips with their children. Even experienced cyclists and pedestrians benefit from reviewing safety tips and rules of the road.

Specific to Earl Beatty:

There are bike racks located on Glebehome and Wolverleigh. Bikes and scooters can be locked up here.

Once you're on the property, please get off your wheels.

Drivers: With more "active travellers," we remind you to use extra caution. The roads around our school are narrow. Please be aware of your surroundings, especially at drop-off and pick-up. Be patient. Mornings are **tough**, and we're all in a rush. Please consider it may be safer to park a little farther or drive around the block one more time until a space opens up rather than blocking traffic or driveways. It's recommended that children exit the vehicle on the sidewalk side.
