

FAQ: Youth Opportunities Global Ambassador Program (GAP) 2023

1. I am facing technical difficulties while filling up the form. What to do?

2. When will you announce the result?

We are planning to get back to the shortlisted candidates within a month of the deadline for an interview. However, since we receive a lot of applications, the review process may take some time.

3. How will I know if I am selected or not?

Whether you are selected or not, will be informed to you through email. So please keep checking your inbox and spam folder.

4. Can international students apply for the Global Ambassador program if they are studying in a country abroad?

Yes. International students are encouraged to apply, and their applications will be considered if they meet the eligibility criteria. Please note that they need to represent the country they reside in at the time of applying and during the Global Ambassador Program.

For example, if an Indian youth is studying in Germany, he/she can apply to be the Global Ambassador of Germany, NOT India.

Please note that **Bangladeshi Students** residing in Bangladesh are not eligible to apply to the Global Ambassador Program 2023. This is because we have a separate

program just for Bangladeshi youth, which is the Campus Ambassador Program 2023.

5. What happens if I do not have a WhatsApp Account?

We encourage everyone to have an active WhatsApp account. Since a lot of official communication and coordination will be done through WhatsApp, we request our team to open a WhatsApp account if they do not already have one. Opening one takes up very little time, so please provide us with a VALID and reachable number.

6. Is it okay if I do not have any work experience?

We encourage everyone to apply. Work experience will be an added advantage. However, please note that full-time/part-time work experience is not mandatory. If you can prove to us your eligibility and enthusiasm, you may have a chance of getting selected as your country's representative and becoming a member of Youth Opportunities' Global Ambassador Program.

7. Is participating in co-curricular activities mandatory?

It is highly encouraged, as we want our ambassadors to be proactive from the start. Previous co-curricular activities will be taken into consideration while evaluating your application. Please do not shy away from sharing every other thing you do besides your study so that we can have a better idea about you.

8. When will the results be published?

After the initial screening process, shortlisted candidates will be asked to sit for an online interview. The results can be expected 7-10 days after the interview phase.

However, the expected date may change depending on the number of applications. Please connect with our social media pages to keep yourself updated.

9. What is the time period of the program?

If you are finally selected as an ambassador, your engagement with YO will be for one year. However, this tenure can be extended based on mutual understanding and your performance.

10. What are the must-have requirements?

Please look through the eligibility section again.

11. Can there be more than one Ambassador from one country?

Yes, there can be more than one Ambassador from one country. But it will depend on the quality of the applications.

13. Is there any cost for applying for his program?

No, there is no cost for applying to the program.



14. Is this a voluntary program?

The "Global Ambassador Program" is a cause-based voluntary program that does not involve any monetary benefits.

15. Can I apply if I am a last-year student?

Yes, last-year students are encouraged to apply as long as they have at least an entire year remaining in their current institution and living in the same country for the whole tenure.
