- Analyze how the Constitution divides powers among various levels and branches and preserves individual rights
- Identify key rights and freedoms protected by the Bill of Rights and explain why those freedoms are important in their own lives

An Expanding Nation, Americans in the Mid1800s

- Describe the changing boundaries of the United States throughout the 1800s
- Analyze the motives, hardships, and economic incentives associated with westward expansion

The Union Challenged

- Trace the effects of territorial expansion on the debate over slavery
- Explain how key events of the Civil War, like the Battle of Gettysburg, affected soldiers and civilians
- Examine the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, and Fifteenth Amendments and their role in Reconstruction
