2. What are ways in which my parish already excels at being on mission?

We are not excelling presently-need to be more open to all regardless of where they are personally on their faith journey-many of our leaders are judgmental

Good catholic school system; 24 hr. adoration

we are just surviving we are not thriving

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*throughout the last 3 years there have been more people getting involved with church administration and activities. This came about after some of those who did everything left. Change can be good

It doesn't

we excel by collaborating /sharing with others (Resurrection, St. Michaels and St. Anne);
Joining CCD confirmation classes; Sharing priests/deacons

I think this is the weakest part of our parish we need to do a better job of reaching out and making people feel welcome

we have a faithful priest, deacon and parishioners
