Parent Overview Year 3 Autumn 2025



This overview provides you with information about what your child will be learning during the Autumn Term. In addition, all pupils will continue to learn about the Catholic Virtues and British Values as appropriate throughout the curriculum. English

This term we will be reading and writing a range of genres.

We will learn and refine several skills including -

- Making predictions and using inference and retrieval skills in guided reading.
- Writing narratives, diary entries, instructions and nonchronological reports.
- Exploring the features of different text types before planning and writing.
- Understanding sentence structure and how we can use a range of conjunctions to extend our sentences.
- Using expanded noun phrases to describe.

<u>Maths</u>

This term we will be learning -



- How to order numbers to 1000.
- Most efficient use of the formal written methods for all four operations.
 - How to apply our own knowledge to a wide range of problems and investigations.
- How to work efficiently with 100s and 1000s.
- How to count in 50s.
- How to add and subtract two and three digit numbers.
- The 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

Religious Education

This term we will be learning about -

- The topic of belonging
- Reconciliation
- The Eucharist
- Advent.

Science

This term we will be learning about

- What nutrients our body needs to stay healthy.
- The human skeleton and the bones that we have.
- How our muscles help us to move and human and animal skeletons.

Computing

This term we will be learning how to-

- Use a range of sources to research.
- Stay safe online.
- Understand computing systems and networks.

History

This term we will be studying -

Tribal Tales: What was life like 5000 years ago?

We will be exploring what life was like in the Stone age, Bronze age and Iron age. We will learn about how and why life changed during these times and use historical sources for research. Children will extend their knowledge about life in this era while also developing their history skills such as making comparisons across ages, examining artefacts and sequencing events from history.

Geography

This term we will be studying -

Where does our food come from?

We will be learning about food production in the UK and from overseas and how this is imported or exported. We will also explore climate zones and how these affect food production, using maps, globes and atlases to support us in our learning. Children will also not only extend their knowledge but develop a range of geographical skills too. This will include locating countries on a world map, using maps to plot journeys and describing geographical features using atlases.
