VIII. Business Items		A. For the 2026-27 school year, Madison is projected to receive \$15,050 from LCFF. That is \$14,770 less than last year. We still have \$9,220 remaining from this year. LCFF cannot carry over to the next year. For rec aides, Madison will receive \$51,750 which is just \$250 less than last year. In Title 1 funds, we will receive \$44,000 which is \$9,000 less than last year. We still have a balance of \$52,425 from last year (We had \$99,569 w/rollover). We will receive \$2,150 for Title 1 Parent Inv. Prop 28 funds will be \$65,888 which is \$12,900 less. We have a balance of \$38,755 of this year's Prop 28 funds which can roll over to next year. All unspent balances at the end of 2025-26 will carry over (Prop 28 and Title 1), to 2026-27. However, in 2026-27, at least 50% of unspent balances will not carry over to 2027-28. B. Classrooms will stay the same for next year with 2 teachers per grade level in general ed. An SDC TK classroom will be added for a total of 5 SDC classes. With the added TK, we are projected to have 425 students for the 2026-27 school year. Madison will have a fulltime IIC, Math lead, Literacy Lead, IOA, and counselor. Librarian time will be reduced from 2

days to one day, and the Parent Engagement Facilitator and Care Center will be eliminated.

- C. VAPA office is looking to have a balance of performing and visual arts within the schools. Three options are available for 2026/27 school year VAPA funding and will be voted on at the December 16 meeting:

- a. Option 1 - Same as this year
 - i. 2 days vocal music (.2+.2)
 - ii. .4 instrumental music
 - iii. art - Meet the Masters
- b. Option 2 - change art
 - i. 2 days vocal music (.2+.2)
 - ii. .4 instrumental music
 - iii. 1 day (.2) \District art
- c. Option 3 - 2027-28 Model
 - i. 1 day (.2) vocal music
 - ii. .4 instrumental music
 - iii. 2 days (.4) District art

After sharing the teachers' preference of Option 2, Ann Erskine **made a motion to approve Option 2**. Cassandra Hodges **seconded**. **A discussion followed**. Mrs. Erskine presented that this information was shared with the teachers, at a Sankofa meeting, and at Coffee with the Principal. It was scheduled to be shared at our ELAC meeting, but no parents attended the meeting. Parents shared their preference to move from Meet the Masters, which is only 4 times a year, to a district art teacher in the hope of giving students more access to art. It was also discussed that Meet the Masters is more art appreciation where students learn about a particular artist and then create a piece in that artist's style. An art class taught by an art teacher would allow the students to create art in their own style. **After the discussion, option 2 passed unanimously.**
