



National Parks (Establishment of New National Parks) Order 2022

This order is made under section 7 of the Conservation Act 1980 on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister for the Environment.

Order

1. Title

This order is the National Parks (Establishment of New National Parks) Order 2022.

2. Commencement

This order comes into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3. Addition of New Parks

On recommendation from the National Parks Authority, made after consultation with the appropriate conservation board, two new National Parks are to be Established.

- (1) Te Tara/Coromandel National Park, to be established in the current DoC conservation areas between 36.46°S and 37.17°S on the Coromandel Peninsula
- (2) Maeroero/Catlins National Park, to be established in the current DoC conservation land between (46.66°S, 168.85°E), (46.42°S, 168.85°E), (46.33°S, 169.77°E), and (46.66°S, 169.87°E)

4. Renaming of Parks

On recommendation from the National Parks Authority, made after consultation with the appropriate conservation board, the following National Parks are to be renamed:

- (1) “Egmont National Park” will be renamed to “Taranaki Mounga National Park”
- (2) “Fiordland National Park” will be renamed to “Ata Whenua/Fiordland National Park”
- (3) “Abel Tasman National Park” will be renamed to “Kupe/Abel Tasman National Park”
