- IV. 11:45am to 11:50am Review of August and September 2022 minutes
  - a. We do not have a quorum to approve minutes at this time.
  - b. A question is raised about voting according to the bylaws which Ms. Bartenstein could not answer in the moment. It turns out ½ of membership is considered a quorum for this group. That document is linked here for future reference: FYC Bylaws
- V. 11:50am to 12:05pm Pending Issues of Concern from September 2022 meeting
  - a. What should happen with regional center at 16 we are making a request of the DCSF regional center liaison to attend a future meeting to address this question.

- b. Follow up on Mr. Avery's previous concern about getting extra help for his son he was able to call for an emergency IEP meeting and the team agreed to complete an assessment for 1:1 support in the next 60 days.
- VI. 12:05pm to 12:15pm New Issues of Concern to Foster Parents
  - a. Damon Avery It took 4 years for the special education department to agree to complete the assessment they are currently undertaking. Do we have a right to insist that on an assessment, or does the school have to approve of doing that assessment in order to do it?
    - i. Ms Lopez-Torres there is a right to request the 30-day IEP. Encourages Mr. Avery to continue reaching out to the fantastic team at PUSD, and for foster parents in other districts to connect with their educational advocates at LACOE.
    - ii. Ms. Suarez Parents always have the right to call for an amendment meeting at any time, and if it is refused, to receive an explanation as to why this decision was made.
    - iii. Ms. Lopez referred Mr. Avery to the Disability Rights California IEP Parent Rights manual. The senator's office works with Disability Rights California and if you need additional support, Ms. Lopez's email is <a href="mailto:Kristi.lopez@sen.ca.gov">Kristi.lopez@sen.ca.gov</a> to facilitate a connection with their contact there.
    - iv. Ms. McKinley clarified that the Disability Rights California document is the <u>Special</u> Education Rights and Responsibilities manual.
    - v. Ms. Bennett shared her positive experience working with a DCFS education advocate, and a parent advocate through their children's other psychological service providers
  - b. Damon Avery School Safety concerns on the Blair campus. His child has concerns about bullying and retaliation, anxiety about returning to school, and returned to the middle school campus for safety when he was threatened by other students. Where should students with these kinds of safety concerns go?
    - i. "Fight Fridays" at Blair where a weaker student is targeted and attacked
    - ii. Ms. McKinley Asks is there a safety plan in the student's IEP? Encouraged Mr. Avery to request a new IEP meeting to address this now ineffective safety plan.
    - iii. In school suspension and home suspension Mr. Avery also raised his concern at how suspensions are handled for students with disabilities when they are taken advantage of by other students, as happened with his child.
    - iv. Ms. Sandoval suggested reaching out to the social worker on campus if available for additional support.
    - v. Ms. Lopez reached out to a contact with their office, they are aware of and working with the city of Pasadena to address these kinds of gang related issues at Blair and other schools in our community.

a. Special Education Representative - the request for a representative from special education has been forwarded to Dr. Jacobs.

- b. Aeries contact info Dr. Reynoso's office is working with Alliance for Childrens' Rights to implement best practices, including this kind of contact information, and is collaborating with the IT team to create the structures needed to implement.
  - AB740 has been signed into law which extends notification requirements re:suspension/expulsion/etc to the CSW and Attorney. Ms. Lopez provided a link to the analysis on AB740.
- c. PALs Program This previous question (How does the future planning for the PALs program support foster youth? Is there a recording/recap from the 10/11 Facilities Master Plan meeting re: spaces devoted to the PALs program?) is also best addressed by the special education department, and would probably need to be an agenda item for a future meeting.
- d. We do have an update on data on Foster Youth the current count is 215. Ms. Suarez should be able to share that data broken down by school site with the council as well.
- e. Website implementation currently PUSD does not have a webmaster, so that project is on hold until a new webmaster is on board. The planned website includes interactive elements and information flow for various stakeholders and will integrate with additional print materials e.g. a planned bookmark that connects to those resources via QR code.
- f. Introduced Lilian Avalos, our new Early Intervention specialist. Ms. Avalos works hand in hand with community liaisons and counselors, and brings to this role great experience with McKinney-Vento. She will be managing BID meetings, and working with the Educational Passport system. She's been jumping into all the training since joining the department in this role.
- g. PUSD has updated the STARS brochure and it is being printed, a more academic focused brochure for grades 9-12 has been developed as well. These materials will be distributed to all of our sites.
- h. The team opened a STARS site at McKinley, rm A211, and visiting sites across the district, the team is also working with Marshall to expand STARS space.
