Mission Statement

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### **1 Introduction:**

Catholic education promotes an appreciation of the value and richness of a child's own culture and that of the cultural diversity in each local community and beyond. It calls for an awareness that cultures, different from one's own, have their own special qualities and that the people of these cultures need to be met and understood as they are, not stereotyped.

### **2 Definition of Cultural Development:**

Pupils' Cultural Development involves pupils acquiring an understanding of cultural traditions and ability to appreciate and respond to a variety of experiences. They acquire a respect for their own culture and that of others, an interest in others' ways of doing things and curiosity about differences. They develop the knowledge, skills, understanding, qualities, and attitudes they need to understand, appreciate, and contribute to culture. In order to make provision for Cultural Development, existing knowledge, interests and experiences are strengthened and then built upon further. In this way pupils gain a deeper understanding of their own culture and the factors which influence it and gain a broader understanding of other cultures and cultural influences.

All areas of the curriculum are used to promote and develop cultural awareness, although the arts, music, dance, drama and art are often used. Culture gives expression to a community's spirituality, morality and social values. At FCJ Primary School we recognise that the personal development of pupils- spiritually, morally, socially and culturally, plays a significant part in their ability to learn and achieve.

### **3 Aims of Cultural Development:**

We aim to provide a Catholic education that provides children with opportunities to explore and develop the Gospel values and beliefs, spiritual awareness, high standards of personal behaviour, a positive caring attitude towards other people, an understanding of their social and cultural traditions and an appreciation of the diversity and richness of other cultures.

The aims of Cultural Development relate to differing aspects of the word 'culture.' These are as follows:

- 3.1 to develop a sense of belonging to pupils' own culture and being proud of their cultural background.
- 3.2 to respond to cultural events.
- 3.3 to share different cultural experiences.
- 3.4 to respect different cultural traditions.
- 3.5 to understand codes of behaviour, fitting to cultural tradition.
- 3.6 to respond to cultural events.
- 3.7 to share diverse cultural experiences.
- 3.8 to respect diverse cultural traditions.
- 3.9 to understand codes of behaviour, fitting to cultural tradition.



#### **4 Objectives for Cultural Development:**

The aims of Cultural Development relate to differing aspects of the word 'culture.' These are as follows:

- 4.1 to develop an understanding of different cultural traditions.
- 4.2 to appreciate the values and customs of other ethnic and faith groups which make up our local community, and the world beyond.
- 4.3 to develop the ability to value current cultural enthusiasms, icons, music and media, critically and independently of peer pressure.
- 4.4 to develop an understanding of diverse cultures and beliefs.

#### **5 Opportunities for Cultural Development:**

- 5.1 Within the curriculum, children will be able to explore:
  - 5.1.1 Their own opinions about local and global issues.
  - 5.1.2 The importance of active listening to others when discussing cultural diversity.
- 5.2 Opportunities will be provided for children to:
  - 5.2.1 Gain insights into the way of life, cultural traditions, moral and social developments of other people.
  - 5.2.2 Foster appreciation and understanding of different cultures, religions and traditions.

#### **5.3 Planned opportunities for Cultural Development:**

Cultural Development is the responsibility of the whole school community. It is made through the planned and hidden curriculum. In other words, at FCJ Primary School we address morality both explicitly and implicitly.

#### **5.4 We address Cultural Development explicitly through:**

Developing partnerships with outside agencies and individuals to extend pupils' cultural awareness, for example, theatre and museum visits.

The delivery of lessons within our PSHE provision.

The delivery of lessons within our Geography provision.
