



PAROT's Student Survey functionality enables efficient collecting, analysing and acting on evidence about student engagement, wellbeing or experiences of the classroom to inform teachers and leaders in New Zealand secondary schools.

The key differentiator with PAROT is that surveys are integrated with your KAMAR Timetable and student data so students can easily answer questions about each of their timetabled subject areas alongside whole school questions. This allows you to collect data about how students are experiencing each of their subjects, making meaningful comparisons while maintaining anonymity for students and ownership of the data for teachers. We call these **subject based questions**. There is also the option of **school-wide questions** which ask students about their experiences of school as a whole.



Student voice responses can be analysed on the following levels

- View Student feedback: This is the individual teacher dashboard and is available only to the relevant teacher through their login
- Department Summary: Available to specified HODs to view their department data. HODs are given permissions through the admin console User permissions.
- Whole School: Enables analysis of school wide trends for subject based questions. Available to specified staff, usually SLT to analyse trends across the school.
- School wide: Enables analysis of school wide trends for school-based questions. Available to specified staff, usually SLT to analyse trends across the school.

Creating the survey

To create your survey go to Admin Settings > Student Surveys > Survey Settings



When creating a survey give it an identifier that is easy for staff to select the appropriate one when looking at results. To create a new survey, just change this identifier and any new responses will be codes for that new survey.

There are two types of questions that can be set:

• **School-wide questions** are asked only once for each student to give feedback on their experience as a whole.

• **Subject by subject questions** are repeated for each subject the student is currently enrolled in on the KAMAR timetable.

Selecting the right questions. Recommendations include:

- Asking as few questions as possible to reduce survey fatigue in students and increase the chance of meaningful answers.
- Aligning questions with annual goals or PL priorities such as AfL
- Consulting with teachers about what questions will be asked

Each question will have the following:

- Question type: Radio boxes / Drop down / Multi-select / Free text
- Full text of the question: This
- Short identifier: This is what is stored in the database and displayed on the output graphs
- Answers: the choice of answers available
- Colour Hexes: The hex codes for colours of the output

Distributing the survey

Once the survey is ready, it can be distributed with a simple link to all students via email or QR code. Students just have to login with their school google login.


Supporting students

It is strongly recommended that students are guided through the response process to enhance the value of the survey. We can provide examples of presentations and ways that schools have done this to maximise response rate and validity.

Checking completion

Check on student completion by going to the PAROT Teacher Login > Student Surveys > Check Student Completion. This allows quick follow up with students who have not yet completed the survey to get a more representative sample for teachers.






Custom Export & Analysis

All data collected through student surveys can be easily exported for custom analysis. Go to Student Surveys > Export data in the admin console

This is the best way to get free text answers for analysis.



Response Settings

To customise the display of data through the PAROT dashboard go to Admin Settings > Student surveys > Response Settings

'Good' Responses

By default, PAROT focuses on showing the distribution of responses, rather than just averages/means. This can be hard to interpret for some teachers. To support this we allow for 'good' responses to be identified so that is clearer to the teacher. These would be the responses from students that would be considered sufficient or desirable.

Questions to display

You can select which questions to display and which to hide. For example, if one question was felt to not be not clear or well interpreted by students it may not be as helpful so can be hidden from results.

This can be done for the subject based questions and for School-wide questions.



Comparisons

Choose which comparisons to show to staff


- Subject: Shows the distribution of results for all students in the same subject/course
- Cohort: Shows the distribution of results for the student in the selected class for their other subject areas.
- Department: Shows the distribution of results for all students in the same department as the selected course/s
- Year: Shows the distribution of results for all students in the same year level/s as the selected course



By default we set it so graphs will only display if there are 3 or more classes in the comparisons to avoid singling out other teacher's results.


Groups

Groups can be created to support filtering the data. In particular schools may be interested to see if there are significant differences between gender or high/low attenders. Custom groups can be made by pasting in student IDs.



Once response settings are set, staff can view graphs through the Student Surveys display on the home page.





Analysing Responses

Once all the data has been collected it can be distributed directly to teachers to inform their inquiries, improvement plans or more specific student voice engagement. We highly recommend that teachers are supported prior to receiving their data to frame the analysis process and to see the data as improvement focussed and private. Graphs are shown as 100% stacked bar graphs in order to show the variance across responses.
