

NCEA – 2023

At Green Bay High School, students in Year 10 study a broad range of subjects as they prepare for NCEA Level 1 in Year 11. Students will sit NCEA assessments in literacy and numeracy. Year 10 students in extension classes may also undertake some NCEA Level 1 standards.

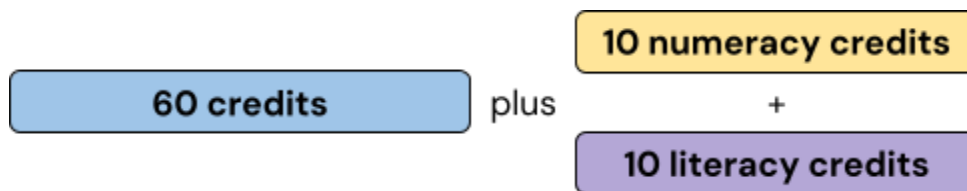
Students in Year 10 during 2023 will typically be aiming to achieve **10 literacy credits** and **10 numeracy credits** this year.

NCEA – 2024

At Green Bay High School, students in Year 11 generally study 6 subjects, including Maths, English and Science. In each subject, students are assessed against a number of standards using methods such as assignments, portfolios, and examinations.

When students achieve standards, they are awarded a number of credits (usually 5 per standard), which are collectively used to gain an NCEA qualification.

Current Year 10 students will typically be aiming to achieve **NCEA Level 1** next year. To be awarded NCEA Level 1 in 2024, a student must achieve:



The **numeracy and literacy** requirements can be earned through:

- Tagged standards in literacy-rich or numeracy-rich subjects
 - Common Assessment Activities (specifically for literacy/numeracy) in Year 10 or 11
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NCEA – Future Years

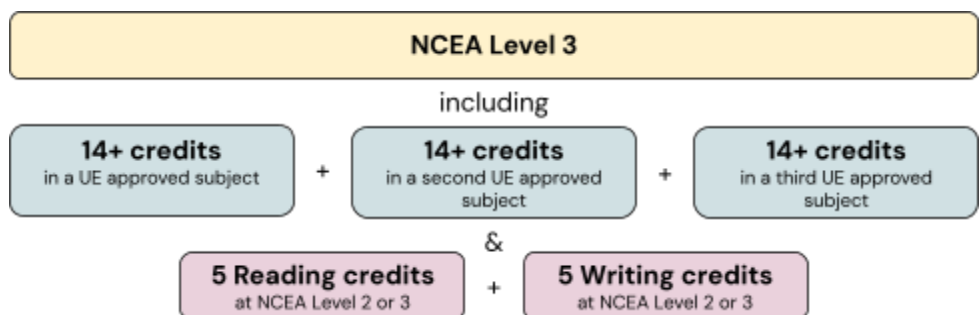
Current Year 10 students will typically be aiming to achieve **NCEA Level 2** in 2025. To be awarded NCEA Level 2 in 2025, a student must achieve **80 credits**, including:



Current Year 10 students will typically be aiming to achieve **NCEA Level 3** in 2026. To be awarded NCEA Level 3 in 2026, a student must achieve **80 credits**, including:



Many students will also be aiming to achieve **University Entrance (UE)** in 2026. To be awarded University Entrance, a student must achieve:
