Attendance News

Well, the Government has made a lot of changes around school attendance.

Their goal is... every child must regularly attend school. That means holding an attendance rate of 90%-100% This means a student should be absent from school for 5 days or less, per term.

Every day our attendance roll is automatically sent to the Ministry of Education and your child's attendance is recorded.

Te Ara Whakamaua (truancy) will visit whanau when the school reports that a student has 3 unexplained absences in a row.

The 90%+ rate is achievable. However, reality can sometimes bite you in the nether regions.


