Unit 5: Student-Empowering Tutoring Strategies

Backward Design Elements

I. Established Goals

- Peer tutors will be able to describe linguistic-justice based tutoring techniques
- Peer tutors will reflect on how to apply these strategies in tutoring sessions and practice these strategies in role plays

II. Essential Questions

- What power does my position as a peer tutor give me?
- How can I leverage my power to empower the students I tutor?
- As a peer tutor, how can I affect equity outcomes at my institution?

III. Topical Questions

- What is code meshing? What might it look like in a tutoring session?
- What is translanguaging? What might it look like in a tutoring session?
- How can I help students make informed decisions about their rhetorical choices?
- What classroom policies are unjust and need re-evaluation?
