News from the Middle School Counselor

Hello Middle School Parents,

I hope you enjoyed your extended Songkran weekend! While it certainly wasn't the same, and a lot dryer than year's past, I hope you got to spend some extra time with your families and find a unique 2020 way of celebrating together. With parent-teacher conferences coming up at the end of the week, I wanted to provide some tips that can help you get the most out of these meetings.


- 1) Look through your child's PlusPortals along with them, so you can see their current grades in their classes. You should be able to see not only the overall grades, but also their grades on individual assignments.
- 2) Make note of anything that concerns you. If you see missing grades, talk to your child about the assignments. If the scores are lower than you expected, discuss it with your child first, before coming to the meeting.
- 3) Prepare questions in advance for anything you would like to specifically discuss. Since you may be crunched for time trying to meet with all of your child's teachers, having your most pressing questions prepared in advance will help the teacher tailor the conference to your needs.
- 4) During the conference, teachers may show you the results of assessments or various assignments. If you are not sure what the assessments might be measuring, make sure to ask for clarification.
- 5) Let their teachers know about the successes or concerns you notice at home. If you've seen an improvement in a given class, or if you've noticed your child struggling with certain concepts, be sure to let their teachers know. Teachers would love to know about their successes, and can provide tips or suggestions for ways to work on their concerns.
- 6) Look through each class' Google Classroom. There, you should be able to see a snapshot of what is going on in each class. You can see what topics are being discussed, and what assignments they're working on.
- 7) Listen to your child. Get their input. How do they think their classes are going? Do they think they can improve their effort? Are the classes easier or harder than they thought they would be? Asking questions of them before meeting with their teachers can help everyone with seeing the whole picture.

If you would like to meet with me during parent conferences, I will be available in Room 530. I look forward to hearing from and/or meeting you. If you have any questions for me, please feel free to email me or visit any time!

Dear Parents!

I'm so happy to be teaching your child! I can't believe a month has passed already! This year is

already flying by! As I mentioned in my previous message, we are working in the Lucy Calkins Workshop model this year. Your student is reading and writing and presenting every class. As well, they're responsible for independent reading and writing assignments. They've been working very hard already!

We're just now completing the first class-study novel, Esperanza Rising. This novel tells the story of a young girl whose life is shattered by the death of her father, and she must move to America with her mother. She has to grow up quickly! As we have studied it, we've focused students on characterization: How do the characters interact? How do they develop? How does Esperanza change throughout the course of the novel? It's a light, entertaining read, but it also has many layers the students have explored. Please ask your child to share what they've learned with you!

Our goal this year is to really challenge students to keep improving. Each student will be writing and reading multiple genres, and writing in different styles. This will really test their language development. I promise you that your student will grow this year, though how much is determined by their efforts. The harder they work, the more they'll grow!

Most importantly, we're doing all we can to keep your child safe during this time of COVID-19. I require all of us to wear masks throughout the entire class. I personally ensure each child uses hand gel upon entering the class. We maintain social distancing throughout class. Just before the bell, I spray their furniture with a cleanser, and the students wipe them down. I want to do everything I can to keep your child safe and healthy.

I really hope to meet all of you at the Parent Teacher Conferences on September 11th. I'd love to share more of our approaches with you. As always, you can contact me at any time, and please don't hesitate to ask any questions. I'm here to help!



Ms. Angela's Grade 6 Microscopes Class



Students in grades 5-8 use the Accelerated Reader program to track their reading comprehension skills and obtain points based on the books they read each quarter. Accelerated Reader is a software tool that allows students to select their own book and then assess whether a student has completed reading the book by asking a

series of questions. We keep track of this each quarter and have a big party at the end of the year. Accelerated Reader is administered by the English Department under the direction of Mr. Ted, our Curriculum Coordinator and Head of English. Students in each grade are required to read independent novels and get points each quarter.

Student Computers

The Faculty and Administration believe technology is a powerful and integral part of the TCIS instructional program. While there are many good computers on the market, please understand that the TCIS High School requires MacBooks for all students.

1) **TCIS High School** is a MacBook one-to-one school - MacBooks are required for all grade 9 through 12 students



2) TCIS Middle School

- a) MacBooks are recommended for grades 7 & 8 students.
 - i) A Chromebook is acceptable (remember a MacBook is required for grades 9-12)
- b) School owned Chromebooks are provided for grades 5 & 6 students.
- c) All students in Grades 5-8 need access to a computer at their home. Students will be using Google Classroom and various websites for school work. We do recommend a laptop but any computer for home use is fine. iPads and tables are acceptable but have some limitations. Windows-based computers are fine for home use as well but are not allowed on the school network.

3) TCIS Elementary School

a) School owned technology is provided for elementary students
