Tips for Duluth:

- There is NO WIFI in the DECC. Have a plan on how to communicate with each other.
- Missing or being late to your scouting shift is a strike. No strikes are permitted if you
 want to letter!
- The event center is a couple minutes away from the hotel, so we walk. It's cold outside but in the past it has also gotten hot in the DECC so plan on layering.
- Our hotel has a pool, as long as students are following our core values and being respectful of other guests they've been able to use it in the past
- We do a lot of team cheers, so if your voice gets tired, plan ahead and bring tea/lozenges etc
- Remember to set multiple alarms and not put yourself or your roommates in a position to sleep through or deactivate them
- Get a reasonable amount of sleep and take into account needing to get up between 6 and 6:45
- Take into account that you are sharing a room and that everyone there needs to share
 the bathroom for showering and other things, both at night and in the morning, so think
 about how long you are in there
- Trip will take ~2 hrs so make sure bring a book or some form of entertainment
 - We will also have free time in the hotel most nights
- We are sharing the hotel so be respectful
- There will be a strategy meeting Friday night so if you want contribute bring something to contribute
- BE GP, don't go around making fun of other teams' robots or how they played in matches. This includes when you're out either pit scouting or scouting AND IN THE HOTEL, other teams will be sleeping there as well so please be mindful of that!
- If you are bored don't go on your phone and stay off games, that is disrespectful to the teams currently competing
 - Instead:

- Walk around the pits, either scouting or just meeting people.
- Give someone else a few matches break from their scouting shift
- Check out the other regional going on in the same building
- Many students have found note book scouting to be a fun and engaging way to watch and enjoy the competition
 - We often look to these students during strategy meetings
- As previously mentioned, there will be free time at the hotel. Bring board/card games and playing cards if you have them. Just remember you have to figure out how to pack everything!
