1. Command Philosophy

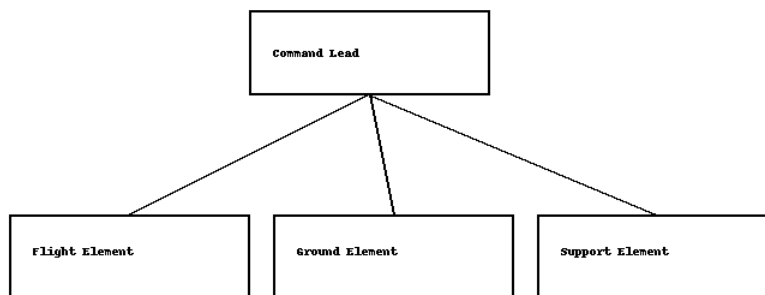
Command must provide clear intent, timely decisions, and stable leadership under stress.

2. Mission Planning Framework

- Situation: Define environment, enemy, friendly, and civilian presence.
- Mission: One clear statement of objectives and constraints.
- Execution: Phased plan of action with timing, triggers, and contingencies.
- Support: Logistics, medevac, resupply plans.
- Command & Comms: Who is in charge where, and how they communicate.
