Taylor's Hotel Magnifique and the generational family secrets of All the Stars and Teeth by Adalyn Grace. This book features a cruise ship setting, found family, and a major character with a chronic illness inspired by my own.

Seventeen-year-old Rosaline "Roe" Damarcus never holds back when raising spirits of the dead, even if it might spare her some trouble. As a morphic, a descendant of witches, Roe must pass a high-stakes trial to keep her treasured morphia magic. Failure means single-handedly disgracing her esteemed family and ruining her plans to follow in her deceased brother's footsteps as a hunter of dangerous morphics. That is, unless she's willing to serve a punishment sentence on The Celestial cruise ship, a vessel that keeps extracted magic out of the realm, for a chance at a retrial. To Roe's horror, she fails her trial and makes the difficult choice to join the staff onboard.
