# CL aim

A claim is an arguable, evidence-based statement used to change the reader's point of view, to bring about some action on the reader's part or to ask the reader to accept the writer's explanation or evaluation of a concept, issue or problem.

### E vidence

Evidence is facts, figures, details, quotations, or other sources of data and information that provide support for claims; should appear in a form and be derived from a source widely accepted as appropriate to a particular discipline.

#### A nalysis

Analysis is a careful examination and evaluation of the evidence used by the writer, and how it supports the claim, legitimizing the claim by showing the evidence to be relevant.

## R elevance

Examine the consequences, results, implications, or ramifications of the information provided by the writer to create a broader significance.
