Objective:

Students will learn how kindness and compassion can help make people feel welcome.

Activities:

Students will learn and discuss the Do's and Don'ts of Making New Friends (See chart)

Students will also sort cards about proper ways to maintain friendships. (See attached cards)

Students will write how Bear showed kindness in order to maintain friendships. (See writing activity)

When Meeting New Friends, Do:

- Introduce yourself
- Ask them their name
- Say "It's nice to meet you."
- Smile and use good eye contact
- Shake their hand
- Invite them to join in
- Act interested in meeting them

When Meeting New Friends, Do Not:

- Ignore them
- Forget to tell them your name
- Look away when speaking
- Act uninterested
- Walk away without ending the conversation
- Make fun of them
- Exclude them from joining in
