

Instructions for Art Lessons:

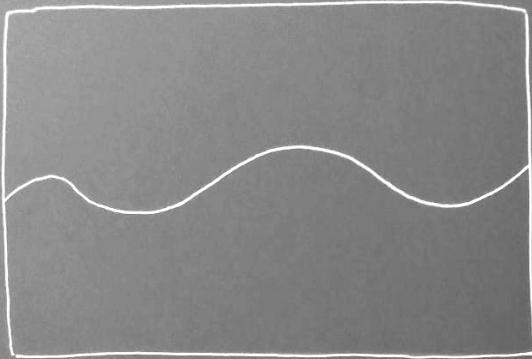
- Do what you can. Not everyone may have all the art tools we have in the art room. That's okay! Use what you have.

Art is meant to be fun. Enjoy the process, don't stress, and above all, let your creativity shine!

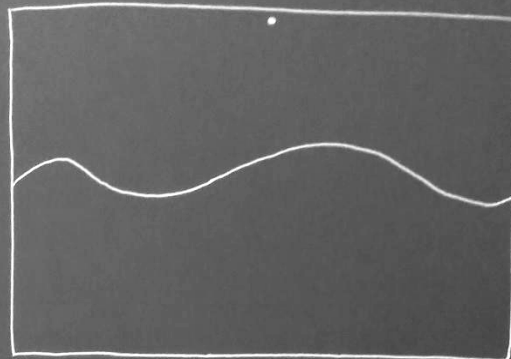

Lesson 1: Landscapes with patterns

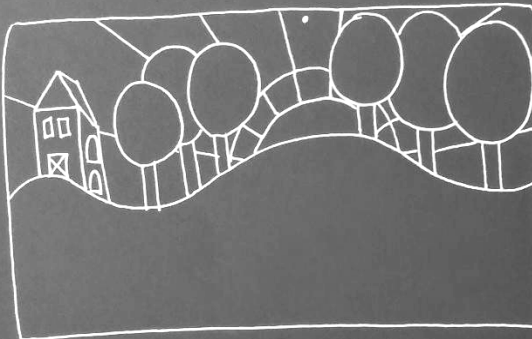
How to Draw a Landscape,
inspired by Heather Galler



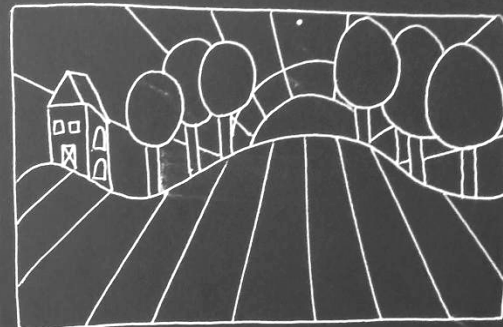
1. Draw a wavy horizon line.



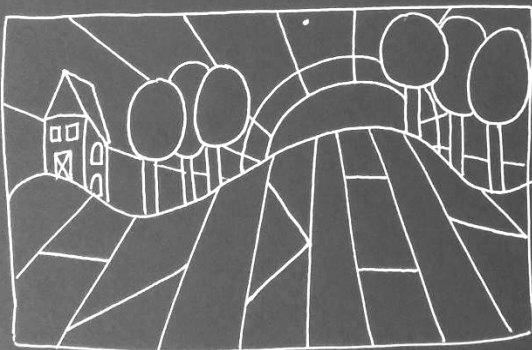
2. Draw a small vanishing point near top of paper.



3. Draw a hilly scene above horizon line. You can include trees, a sun, clouds, a house...



4. Draw lines from the vanishing point below the horizon line only.



5. Add lines horizontally and diagonally on land below horizon line.



6. Add patterns to land. Add details to sky and trees.

A **Landscape** is an artwork that focuses on land, and includes things like mountains, hills, forest, trees and bodies of water.

Directions to create a landscape:

1. Draw a wavy horizon line on your paper. A **Horizon Line**/eye level refers to a physical/visual boundary where sky separates from land or water.
2. Draw a small **Vanishing Point** near the center top of your paper. This is where the land lines will meet later.
3. Create a scene above the horizon line. For this landscape, include things you would find in nature like trees and the sun.
4. Imagine **vertical** and **diagonal** lines coming from the vanishing point you made in step 2 going downward off the paper. Draw these lines, but only the part that is below the horizon line.
5. Now add **horizontal** and diagonal lines between the lines you just made in step 4.
6. Add **patterns** below your horizon line.
7. Add details with lines to area above horizon line
8. Color your work

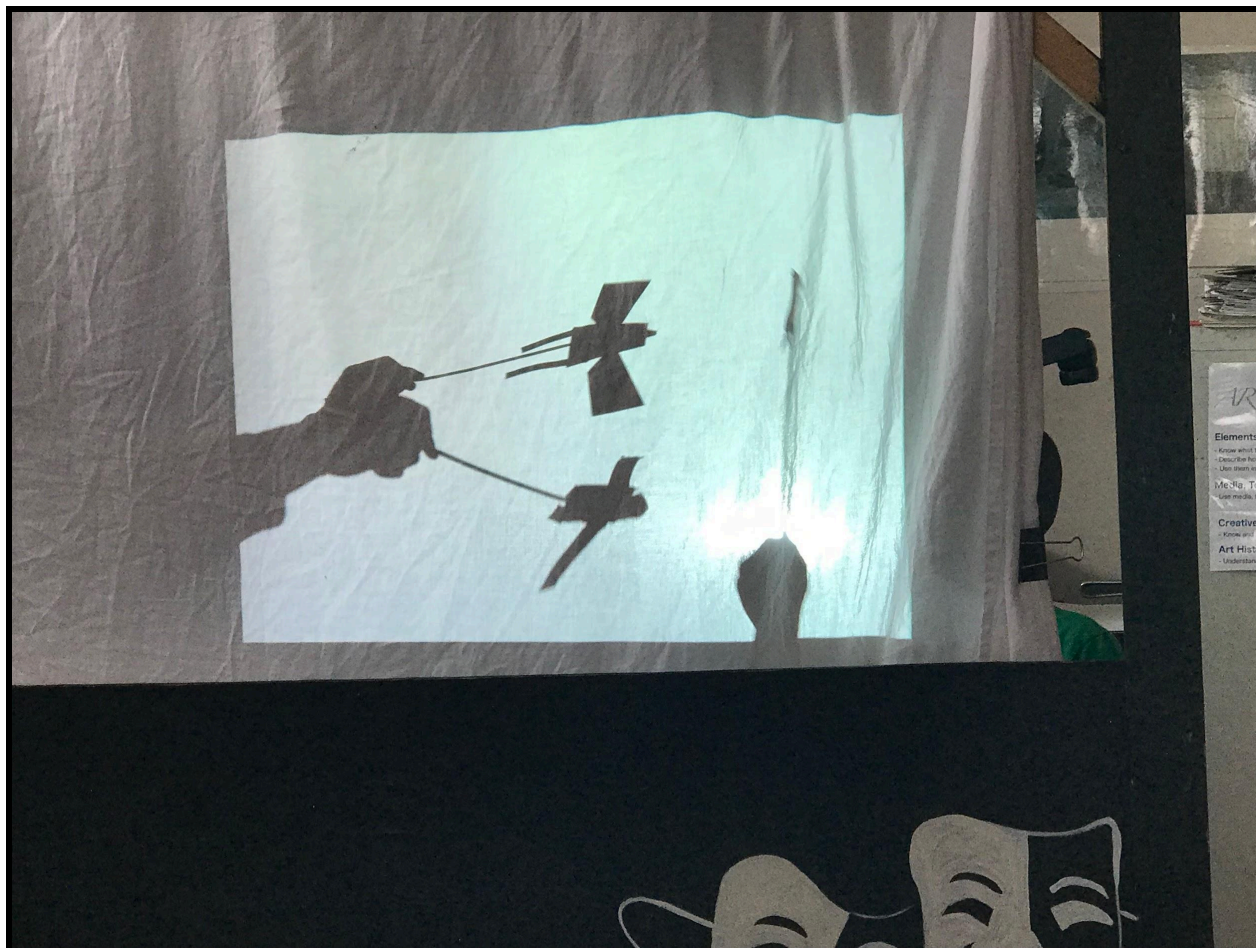

Let's have some fun using **shapes** to make art!

FIRST: Learn about Shadow Puppets.

What is it?

A shadow puppet is a flat human or animal shape attached to thin sticks. People use shadow puppets for telling stories by moving them in front of light to make shadows on a screen (or the wall.)

What does it look like?

Here is a really beautiful shadow puppet show. The puppets and scenery are made from natural materials.

SECOND: Play with hand shadows on your wall.



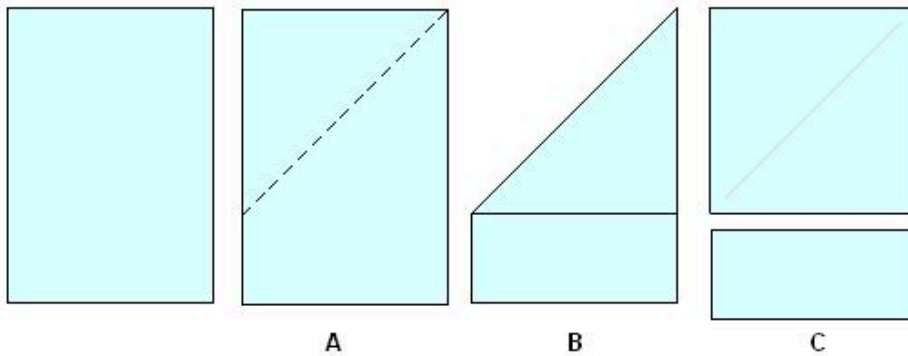

THIRD: Make an origami shadow puppet. You will need a square piece of paper. Here is how I make a square piece of paper.

- A. Take a sheet of rectangular paper and fold it as shown.
 - B. Use the edge as a guide to cut off the lower rectangle.
 - C. Unfold the triangle and you will get a square with a diagonal crease in it.
- You can save the excess paper for another project.



Use any piece of paper you can have. It can have writing on it, because you are using the shape of the paper for your art. If you don't happen to have scissors to cut the paper just fold it back and forth until you have a really good crease and then you can tear the small piece from the big piece.

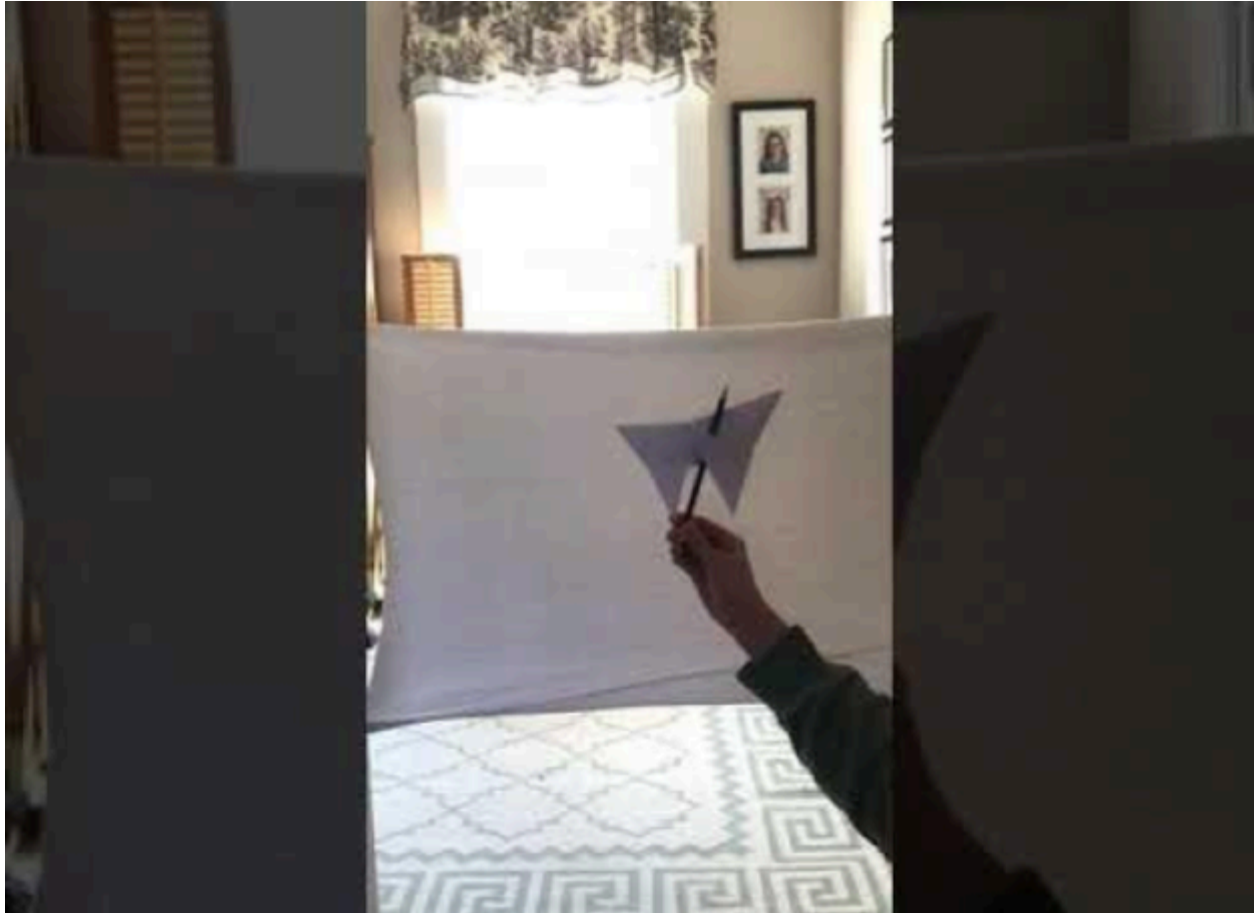

FOURTH: Make a shadow puppet by tearing or cutting a piece of cardboard from a box or stiff paper. I used a piece of mail to make my cat shadow puppet.

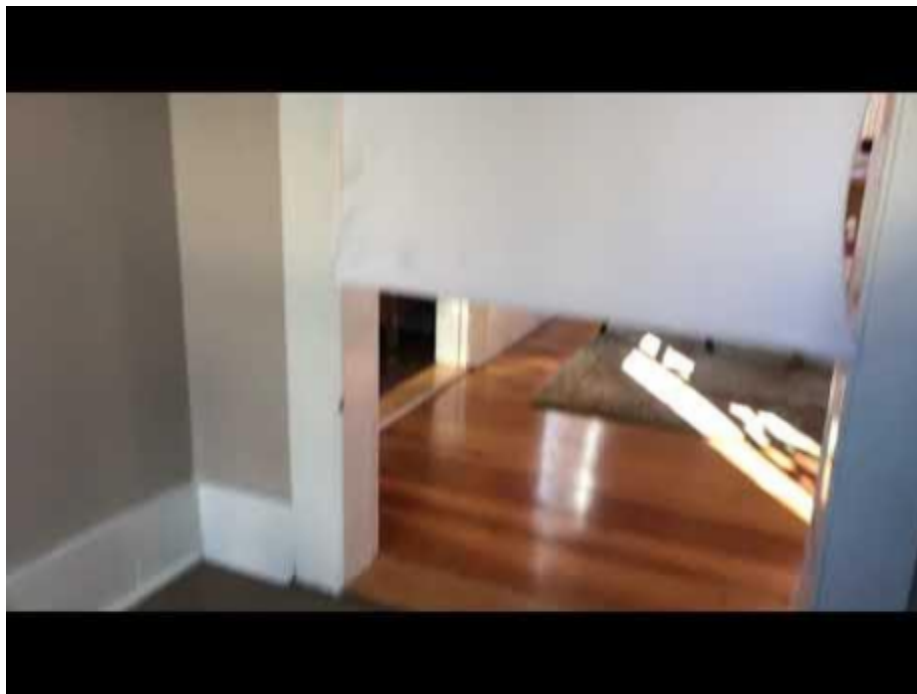


You can hold your shadow puppet or attach it to some kind of stick.



FIFTH: You can make a theatre, or just skip this and play on your wall.

You can use a doorway to make theatre. Here is what I did at my house:

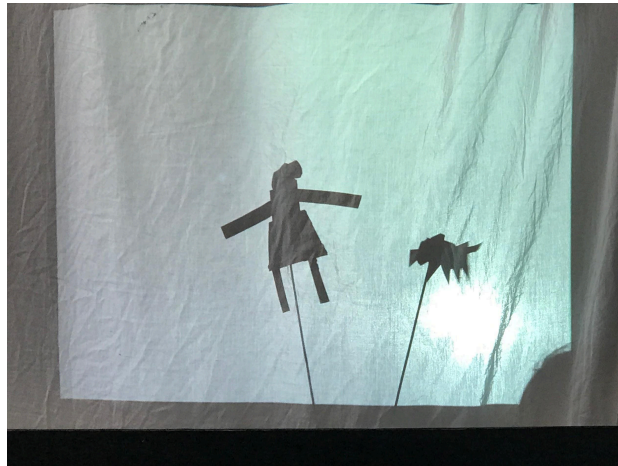
