"Little Women"

"Little Women" is a movie based off of the 1868 novel by Louisa May Alcott. There have been two versions, one with Christian Bale and Winona Ryder in 1994, and the other with Saoirse Ronan and Timothée Chalamet. The story is a realistic portrayal of family, relationships, and life in general. Jo March, the main character, is a sister of four with a passion for literature. All of the sisters were raised to be generous and grateful for everything they had. When their neighbor, Laurie Lawrence, started spending more time around the March's, tension between Jo and Amy grew. While slowly letting go of childhood, the sisters grew apart. After Laurie confesses his undying love for Jo, she turns him down because she knew that after she married, all she would be to society was a married woman rather than a serious novelist. When Amy and Laurie visit London for Aunt March, they find a common spark between each other. One of my favorite dialogues in the film is when Amy has a speech about men being "superior" to women. And if I had my own money, which I don't, that money would belong to my husband the moment we got married. And if we had children, they would be his, not mine. They would be his property. So don't sit there and tell me that marriage isn't an economic proposition because it is." While Jo is going through a rough mental time she finally expresses herself by saying, "Women, they have minds, and they have souls, as well as just hearts. And they've got ambition, and they've got talent, as well as just beauty. I'm so sick of people saying that love is just all a woman is fit for. I'm so sick of it." This is so impactful because even though we don't have the same struggles present day, we still face the same discrimination. For example, the gender pay gap shows women making 16% less money than men do when doing the same work. Since 1919, there has been talk about repealing the 19th amendment (granting women the right to vote) and politicians such as John Gibbs have openly stated that women are not smart enough to be government officials. All-in-all, this movie is a great love story but more importantly a life story. Greta Gerwig is such an astonishing director and screenwriter. It made me feel extremely



On the surface this movie is a beautifully shot story of self discovery and the escapism we find within the media, showing that the race to find ourselves can be aided, as well as hindered by the things we consume. The main protagonist, Owen, is lost in the worlds between "The Pink Opaque" and his own suffocating reality, trying to navigate new findings of himself while simultaneously living in fear of those realizations. On a deeper level, this movie has spoken directly to queer and specifically trans people. Jane Schoenbrun is an openly queer person, and has stated how this movie is a reflection of their experience growing up as a trans person and the intense identity repression they, and many trans people, have been faced with. Through this representation we endure the denial and internal struggle as well as the intense confusion and loss of discovering part of yourself is undeniably wrong, just as the characters do. The atmosphere Schoenbrun creates feels vapid and unsettling, reflecting the often

lonely and isolating experience of finding yourself as a trans youth. However, it also offers fragment hope for many queer people. A chalk drawing on the sidewalk with the words "There is still time", is displayed as a main focus after Owen's only friend, Maddy, goes missing. The timeline of Owen's life is an important part of the movie, as we follow him from the seventh grade up until his 40s. The theme of time running out gets more pressing as we watch Owen grow up unhappy and seemingly smothered by his own existence, settling into a mundane life over authenticity. By the end of the movie, Owen has fully repressed himself, with a gut wrenching last moment on screen, Owen fully and literally opens himself up, then paired with an abrupt ending leaves many viewers distraught. Leaving the audience feeling a similar devastation as all the queer and trans people who have not been able to live their life genuinely. While targeted to a specific audience, "I Saw the TV Glow" is a beautiful film that can be enjoyed by many From its incredible soundtrack, to its captivating cinematography, this film will leave you wanting more for days after seeing it. - Jax McKinnon

"Mario Kart: Double Dash" is a 2003 kart-racing game that was made and published by Nintendo for the Nintendo Gamecube. The main goal of the game is still to drive around the colorful tracks for three laps while dodging projectiles and traps. Double Dash, being the fourth "Mario Kart" game in the series, differs wildly from past entries and future entries. The biggest deviation between the past and future games is the titular gimmick of double drivers. The double driver gimmick is not some cosmetic thing either, as it impacts the races. For example, each character can hold one item, and you can swap which item and which character is in the back with

the Z button. This allows for more strategy, as you can decide to hold on to a powerful item like a star that makes you invisible while using other items to get ahead. But the stand out point of items and characters is the fact that for the first and only time, certain characters have access to special items. Mario and Luigi get a fireball spread shot, Donkey and Diddy Kong get a giant banana that split into several smaller bananas, Bowser and his son Bowser Jr. get a giant Bowser Shell that take up half the track, and all of them add chaos and strategy to the racing.

There are two main modes in "Mario Kart: Double Dash", Grand Prix and Battle. Double Dash's Grand Prix has 16 tracks, the last game to have this many tracks, and the battle mode contains 6 areas. Where it lacks in quantity compared to future entries, the tracks make up for it with quality. There are a lot of unique track ideas in this game. Sure there is the standard desert track in Dry, Dry, Desert, standard ice track in Sherbert Land, and mediocre version of "Mario Kart" staple Mario Circuit. But most of them are gold. Daisy Cruiser has you race on a cruise ship. Mushroom City is a sprawling city that is full of cars that you have to dodge. DK Mountain makes you race down a mountain dodging boulders. They even managed to turn an outline of one of the characters, Yoshi, into a racetrack that is fun to race on and reads as Yoshi called Yoshi Circuit. "Mario Kart: Double Dash" is even able to turn a track like Baby Park, a literal oval, into a chaotic, fun racetrack full of those special, gigantic items. Bruno Mars




