#### Continue:

#### Revise:

- 7. You were missing some journal entries. There was supposed to be 7 separate journals.
- 8. Some of the journals were incomplete or lacked enough detail. I wanted at least half a page for each day minimum and you simply didn't engage in the material quite enough.
- 9. I wanted you to engage in the material--doesn't mean you have to be a Transcendentalist, but this journal wasn't just what you were doing it was about thinking about the philosophy of Transcendentalism even if it was to argue against it. This was just a regular journal.
- 10. The graphic organizer was missing some areas--not every part was filled out.
- 11. The graphic organizer needed more detail. I couldn't tell you read or were paying attention during lectures and reading. I know that you know it, you have to prove it.
- 12. During the reading reviews, I couldn't always tell you had read. You didn't have enough detail in your reviews, relied on the book too much, or didn't know easy answers to questions that were asked. Please try to make time to read these important books.
- 13. Your booth was not interactive enough. Try next time to make it more engaging by having your audience participate with you. Or you could run your idea by Mr. Chilton or your peers to see if it would be engaging enough.
- 14. Your group dynamics need some work. I would recommend dividing up the roles so that everyone is responsible for a specific part, elect a leader to make decisions, and work together to get your work done next time.
