
GRADE 6 Week 9/Trimester 2 Celebrating Black History Month in MUSIC

Scott Joplin (1868-1917)

Have you ever heard of Scott Joplin? He was a famous composer of Ragtime music (the timing in the music jumps around). He was born in Texas and lived with his mother. He would go to work with her as she cleaned houses and at one of the houses, there was a piano. He sat at the piano and a German teacher heard him play and decided to give him free piano lessons. When he grew up, he decided to make music his career and played piano in many restaurants. His first successful piano piece was called "The MapleLeaf Raq." After that was published, he became very well known! Here is another popular piece by Scott Joplin, "The Entertainer". Does it sound familiar?? Yes, many ice cream trucks driving around town use this song to entice you to be happy and have an ice cream! 
The Entertainer-Scott Joplin



Ella Fitzgerald

Ella was an amazing African-American vocalist who became famous for her unique style of singing and improvising. She lived from 1917-1996. As a young girl, Ella lived with her mom and step-father in New York. She put her name in to perform at amature night at the Applo Theater in Harlem and won a spot to perform one night. She planned on dancing but there were so many dancers that she decided to sing and from then on she was asked to sing and perform with famous bands. Some of the people Ella was asked to perform with were Duke Ellington, Nat King Cole, Benny Goodman, Louis Armstrong, and Dizzy Gillespie. Fitzgerald later had her own band entitled "Ella Fitzgerald and her Famous Band." She paved the way for many future female vocalists of all races!
