We're confident that schools don't cover all the real-world skills needed to succeed, and we guarantee you'll learn more with us in a few months than you would in years of university. And no, we're not doing this to check some imaginary corporate box – it's in our best interest to find the hidden gems out there and, ideally, hire them in the future.

What Do I Get Out of This?

I Don't Think I Have ItTM?

Most of our people who have ItTM didn't think that they did. I don't have perfect judgment, but I'm pretty good at spotting ItTM, so if you have ItTM, I'll be able to tell.

I would **STRONGLY** encourage you to shoot your shot and see what happens.

Worst case scenario, you spent some time learning about a weird company and writing an application.

The best-case scenario is that your entire life changes.

It[™] means you're humble, which is definitely a trait we want to see. If I have to argue with you every time I teach you something, it's not gonna work out. Humble means coachable. And being coachable is an essential trait for success in this role.

One of the people who has It^{TM} and eventually went on to an amazing role in another company after getting her start here was a receptionist with limited work experience. She literally thought to herself, "There is no way I'm gonna get this job. This is a waste of time."

She closed the application and went on about her day.

The next day though, it was still bugging her, so she said, "Fuck it." And applied.

Thankfully for us and for her, she did it, and her life is forever changed.

If you think you aren't special or can't compete, don't sell yourself short. I obviously can't make any promises, but the fact that you don't think you have It^{TM} isn't actually evidence that you don't.

If I Pass the Internship, Will I Be Hired?

The whole point of this internship is to broaden our talent pool and find awesome potential out there. If you prove to be awesome and have ItTM, we can definitely discuss potential long-term hiring. I can make no promises, but there is definitely the possibility of things working out like this.

Of course, this depends on a few things, like your availability (we typically hire full-time only, so if you're still in school with strict attendance policies, that might not work) and our hiring needs at the time.

We'll navigate that together and cross the bridge when we get there. Worst case? You walk away with a ton of valuable knowledge and a resume boost.

Are You Gonna Pay Me?

Yes, but don't expect to get rich from this internship.

As most of your time here will be focused on learning rather than producing output, we aren't exactly anxious to pay a ton, but we still value your time and believe unpaid internships are unfair and unethical.

So, we're testing things out on a budget and offering a monthly stipend of \$600 for full-time (around 40 hours per week). The internship should take you around 3 months to complete.

What Is the Virtuous Cycle of Investment?

How I'd like to run things is:

- 1. I invest in you, in the form of training and experience
- 2. You invest in the company, in the form of hard work and dedication
- 3. Ideally, we hire you, and this allows me to invest even more in you

And anyway, the biggest cost to us is the effort required to teach/train you. The opportunity cost of our people's time is quite high (almost certainly higher than your salary), so even if you worked for free, it wouldn't really change the math for us.

So, fuck you, we're gonna pay you, and you're gonna like it.

Can You Tell Me What the Tests Are?

No. We want the experience to be fresh for everyone, so it's an even playing field.

Amongst the high performers at JLS, it's number 2, but you have to decide for yourself which one is true for you.

This may sound ruthless, and it is to some degree, but every hour we invest in someone who doesn't have ItTM is an hour we aren't investing in someone who does have ItTM. We have limited resources and have to deploy those limited resources as efficiently as possible, for better or worse.

Who Will I Be Reporting to?

It's a little unclear at the moment, but it will be one of the senior JLS leaders, or a combo thereof. You'll likely be led and taught by multiple people to maximize your learning.
