The SEE (Semester End Examination) for each course is 70 marks . Minimum pass percentage of SEE is 35% and overall pass mark to be 40 out of 100 marks.

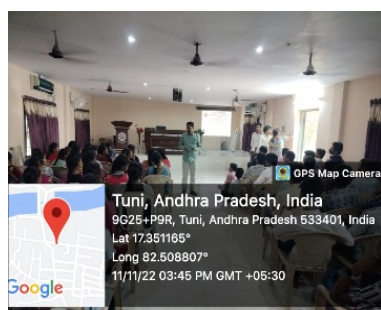
