- d. Women's temptation: attention

6. Main Takeaway from Verses 8-11

- a. Men and women worshipping together was unprecedented
- b. Men: use words and prayer to glorify God and unify the church
- c. Women: reflect godliness through lifestyle and Spirit-filled works

7. Difficult Passage: 1 Timothy 2:12-15

- a. Challenges and differing interpretations
- b. Senior Pastor's responsibility to teach faithfully
- c. Scriptural consistency: distinction of roles in home and church
- d. Male headship = **responsibility of spiritual oversight**, not privilege
- e. Ephesians 5:24-25: mutual submission in marriage

8. Theological Foundation

- a. Creation order: Adam first, Eve created as helper
- b. Adam held responsible for sin despite Eve's deception
- c. Male spiritual leadership rooted in creation, not culture

9. Verse 15 – Salvation and Motherhood

- a. Three phases of salvation (past, present, future)
- b. Childbearing not a means of salvation, but motherhood is eternally significant
- c. Women as vital contributors to God's work in the world
