# **GARAGE AREA**

#### Tasks:

- Inspect door panels for dents, rust, or cracks.
- Check and tighten hardware hinges, brackets, and rollers.
- Inspect weather stripping for gaps or damage.
- Lubricate moving parts (springs, rollers, tracks).
- Install a bracing kit (or verify it's installed and secure).
- Test manual operation in case of power outage.
- Reinforce garage door with vertical and horizontal supports.
- Remove or secure loose items (bikes, tools, trash bins).
- Check garage door opener battery backup (if available).

#### X Supplies Needed:

- Wrench
- Lubricant spray
- Bracing kit or wood planks
- Weather stripping
- Flashlight & batteries

# **STORAGE / UTILITY ROOM (if connected to garage)**

#### Tasks:

- Move stored items away from doors and windows.
- Elevate valuable or moisture-sensitive items.
- Store heavy tools low to the ground to prevent tipping.

## **A ELECTRICAL PANEL ROOM**

#### **Tasks**:

- Know where the garage circuit breaker is located.
- Unplug non-essential electronics in the garage.

### **BEDROOMS / MAIN HOUSE**

## ▼ Tasks (related to garage):

- Move cars into the garage early.
- Make sure garage remote works properly.
- Keep garage door closed during storm updates.

# **OUTSIDE AREA** (around garage)

## Tasks:

• Clear gutters and drainage near the garage.

- Trim overhanging branches.
- Remove potted plants, lawn tools, or decor.

# **EMERGENCY NOTES**

• Garage Door Emergency Release Cord:

Learn how to use it. Usually, a red cord hangs from the opener trolley.

- After the Storm:
  - Inspect door tracks and hardware for damage.
  - Check for water intrusion or mold.
  - o Avoid using the automatic opener until the door is confirmed safe.
