- I preferred to be contacted by email. You can try to call me, but it can be difficult.
- Don't call from restricted numbers as I ban people automatically.

- You are **NOT** allowed to share my data with anybody else and any third party.
- You are **NOT** allowed to use my standard CV for anything else that send to the employer.
- I do **NOT** give permission to store or alter my standard CV.
- You can **NOT** use a Recruiter CV as a standard CV.

### WHAT TO INCLUDE AS MINIMUM IN INFORMATION ABOUT ROLE.

When you write to me about the role, I need at least:

1. Role with seniority,
2. Three primary skills required ( like Language, Framework),
3. Location (nearest Tube station is enough),
4. holiday days (+ is the ability to buy more)
5. hours per week (excluding break).

If you don't provide the above information, then I am unable to figure out, is worth it to check the role or not. Make sure you write "I READ YOUR RECRUITER EDITION" in the title or as the first sentence.

### LOCATION

It must be a **maximum of 45** minutes from Rickmansworth using public transport.

Accepted area: Amersham, Chesham, Rickmansworth, Watford, Uxbridge, Harrow on the Hill, Wembley area (Central, Park, Stadium), West Hampstead, Finchley Road, Baker Street, Marylebone, Paddington, Great Portland Street, Euston, Bond Street and King's Cross St. Pancras.

I may consider Farringdon, Barbican, Moorgate, Westminster, or Liverpool Street.

Excluded areas: Oxford Circus, Piccadilly Circus, Old Street and Victoria station\*.
