“The Boss—‘Well, what are you going to do about it?’”

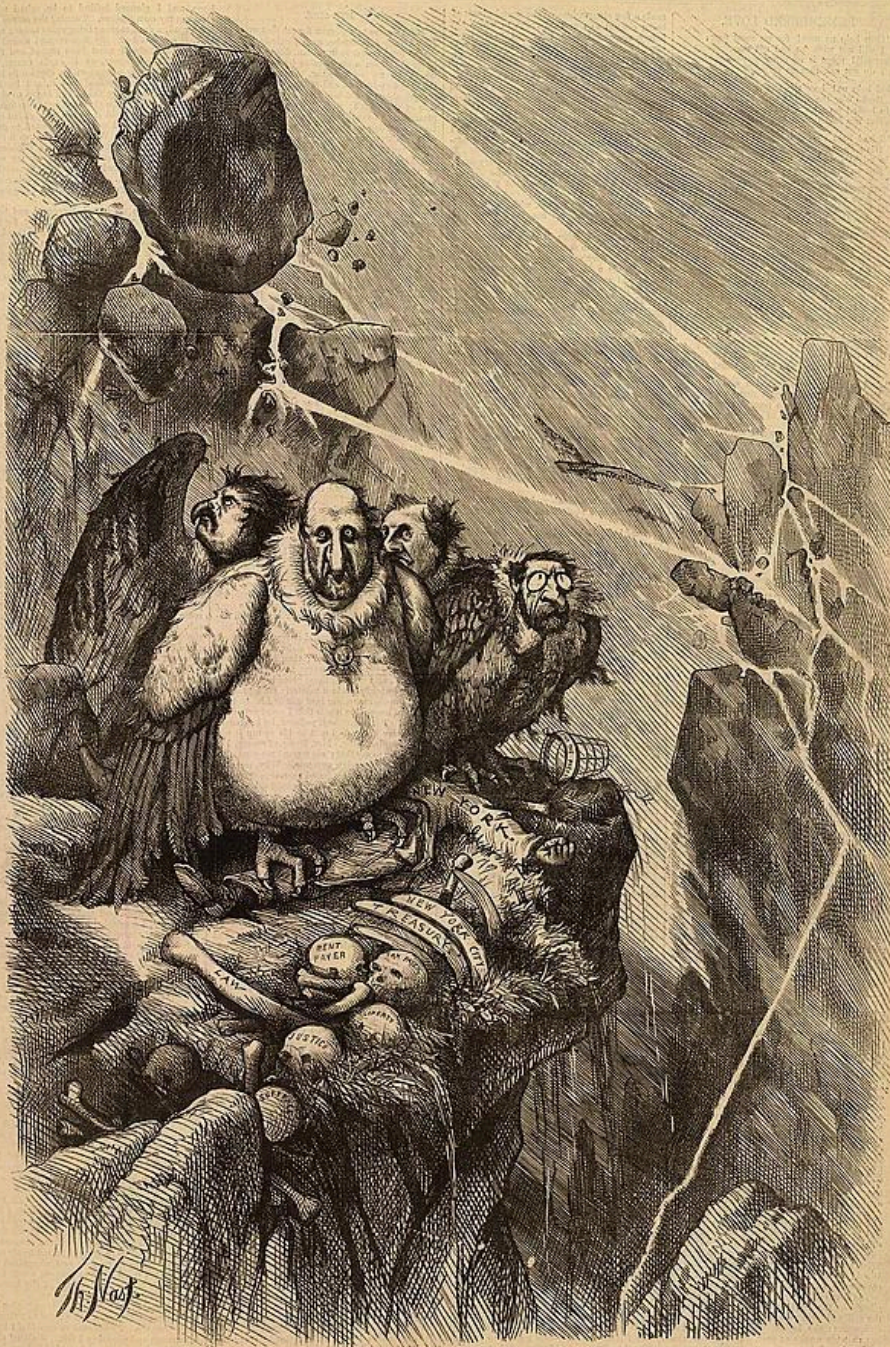


Political Cartoon 2
