#### What is Title I?

#### What is it?

## **Bay Springs Middle is Branching Out!**

Bay Springs Middle School will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other
  activities is published in English and Spanish and other languages as necessary and posted
  on the school website.
- Provide multiple trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- Partner with Ithica, Sharp Creek, and Sand Hill Elementary Schools, Villa Rica High School, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.
- Focus ELA for all grade levels on Oral Reading Fluency (ORF)
- Focus on Vocabulary Strategies in all content areas (ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
- Focus on improving 8th grade Math by focusing on Patterning & Algebraic Reasoning with a specific focus on Linear Relationships.
- Share information on the school website and social media for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school wide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning. This will accommodate Building Staff Capacity Requirements.
- Focus on improving in 6th, 7th, and 8th grade ELA by reading and analyzing literary and information test and by following John O'Connor's Engagement Cycle and consistency with Oral Reading Fluency (ORF).
- Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- Use faculty and staff to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school
  parent and family engagement policy.
- Offer literacy and computer classes for parents and family members to help further enhance their various educational levels.

BSMS will collect feedback from parents and family members at events, Title I parent and student surveys, and post suggestion form on the school website in order to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
