

# Teaching in Days After ... Anti-Asian Violence Guide

This is a co-created guide to teaching in days after incidents of anti-Asian violence, initiated on Wednesday, March 17th, 2021, after news of <u>8 people murdered</u>, including 6 Asian American women, at an Atlanta spa. Images of this and other recent incidents left me personally feeling both vulnerable and angry.

Following this news, an anti-Asian hate email was sent to the Department of Asian American Studies at SFSU, blaming Asians for their victimization.

When harm is done, failure to address that harm compounds that harm.

To combat the paralysis of my fear, I needed to proactively respond by

- 1. Bringing together my community;
- 2. Creating a widely available resource for teachers; and
- 3. Inviting collaboration on this resource.

## Context Narrative

## Caution on Compounding Trauma:

Please be very careful of <u>compounding trauma</u> while addressing incidents of hate and violence. Our Asian American students and colleagues (including faculty, staff, and administrators) have been in a heightened state of fear since the upsurge of anti-Asian violence in connection with the COVID19 pandemic, though this violence is always a constant presence in our lives.

Students have reported their fear of violence directed against Asian American elders affecting their family members, and Asian American women and queer men of all ages experience hypersexualization and racially sexualized targeting in school, work, on the street, and in their homes. This includes our faculty and staff colleagues, from the maintenance staff to the upper echelons of administrators.

Please consider these issues while you plan what to communicate to your students and colleagues.

These shootings and other attacks are rooted in perceptions and stereotypes, which we as educators can change.

How does the sexualization of Asian American women relate to anti-Asian/Pacific Islander/Desi American hate? Can an attraction to Asian women be a kind of racism? The <u>rationalization</u> by <u>authorities</u> of Asian women as "sexual temptation" in response to this violence compounds the negative psychological effects of this violence on our Asian American communities, particularly on both older and younger Asian American women, who have the highest rates of suicidal ideation and are more likely to attempt suicide than any group in the US (<u>Older Asian American Women Have Highest Suicide Rate</u>).

Anti-Asian violence has a long history in the US. Federal policies such as the Chinese Exclusion Act and the Paige Act were founded on racist and intersectional racist/sexist and misogynistic ideologies, fueled by "yellow peril" rhetoric spreads by politicians and newspapers a century ago, just as the COVID19 pandemic has been utilized by politicians and news personalities in the past year for votes and ratings (<a href="https://www.insightintodiversity.com/covid-19-racialized-disease-and-the-yellow-peril/">https://www.insightintodiversity.com/covid-19-racialized-disease-and-the-yellow-peril/</a>).

Hate and violence directed towards our community are rooted in white supremacy and racism. The Atlanta homicides demonstrate the horrifying consequences of racism intersecting with misogyny. Although we continue to be perceived as foreign and threatening, we are not a "yellow peril" to be feared, subjugated or denied full citizenship and democratic inclusion.

Here in the San Francisco Bay Area, hate incidents and hate crimes bombard us ('Slap an Asian' challenge has San Francisco police, Muni on alert). In daily lives on walks in their neighborhoods and in supermarkets as well as in restaurants and bars, members of our university community tell us about their many experiences with bias and exclusion, and these experiences are not reported in the news media (Bay Area filmmaker releases PSA to 'Stop the Hate' against Asian Americans).

Soon after the Atlanta shootings, the SFSU Asian American Studies Department received a hate message via email addressed to our department stating hatred towards Asian Americans and blaming Asians for the victimization to which they are subjected and pitting communities against each other. Almost half of all anti-AAPI acts reported to Stop AAPI Hate have occured in California, with roughly one quarter in the Bay Area (Editorial: Bay Area's anti-Asian violence requires a concerted response). Aggressors often act against Asians because of perceptions of us as presumed "illegal" perpetual

foreigners, model minorities, spreaders of illness and disease, and as exoticized sexual objects and labor competition(<u>The History of Anti-Asian-American Violence</u>). People, too, often regard speaking our languages as threatening. Our collective response is to call for community, allyship, education, and dialogue, and to speak out for our own safety and that of our families and communities (<u>Americans rally against anti-Asian hate Pictures</u>).
