Course Description

Students in Advanced Fashion and Interior Design will develop necessary skills for the management and construction of commercial buildings, industrial garment construction, and related projects. Basic construction techniques are integrated throughout the course in various projects. One or more advanced-level projects will be projects using correct construction techniques and commercial interior design skills. Students will have in-depth experiences using advanced sewing techniques, such as pattern alterations, exploring seams and constructions, the use of facing, and advanced hand stitching techniques, and the use of advanced technology. The student will also develop skills for understanding commercial regulations pertaining to interior design. Upon completion of this course, students should master the knowledge and skills needed for designing and constructing projects in both the fashion and interior design industries, as well as develop a professional portfolio.

Course Level Objectives

The objectives for this course include the following:

- Create a portfolio or project incorporating various construction techniques.
- Investigate the components and process of creating a design line of garments.
- Apply merchandising and promotion strategies for fashion and apparel products.
- Analyze career paths and opportunities in the fashion industry.
- Evaluate commercial interior design.
- Apply concepts of the commercial design process.
- Analyze the specification of surface treatments for use in commercial design.
- Demonstrate design, construction document reading, and other design skills used in commercial design.
- Analyze career paths and opportunities in the interior design industry.
