INFER

Use your observations and contextual information to interpret the item and develop your research strategy

- What message is the creator trying to get across?
- Who is the intended audience for the item(s)?
- What is the significance of the item(s)?
- Was the item meant to be private or shared publicly?
- What bias is being expressed in the item?
- Are there any silences/gaps noticeable in your item?
- How does this additional contextual information change or inform your understanding of your time?
- Did you connect with the item(s) in any way?
- Approach the item from a different critical lens how does this inform your interpretation of the item and its significance?

RESEARCH STRATEGY

What additional resources will help you learn more about your item or your thesis?

- How did your experience with the item differ from your expectations?
- Did the item inform your original research query?
- What additional resources (primary or secondary) could you consult to learn more about your item?
- How has this research process differed from research you've done before? What's similar?
- Sometimes primary research doesn't turn out to be relevant to our research. If this is the case, find another item/collection/resource that could be more relevant.
