



William F. Quinn, 60, formerly of Concord and Natick, died Friday, Dec. 30, 2005, at his South Yarmouth home. He was the husband of the late Mary F. (Callahan) Quinn.

He was born in Cambridge on Feb. 4, 1945, the son of Dorothy F. (O'Hara) Quinn of East Dennis and the late Francis L. Quinn. Mr. Quinn attended Rose Hawthorne School, graduated in 1963 from Concord-Carlisle High School, and received an associate's degree from Massachusetts Bay Community College in Wellesley.

Mr. Quinn was employed as an independent consultant in the computer industry for many years, working for various firms including Nynex, Honeywell, and Harvard University.

A Natick resident from 1978 until 1994, he was a co-founder and president of the Natick Soccer Club and was a soccer coach for many years.

He was a resident of South Yarmouth for the past five years. He was a devoted Catholic and constant communicant and enjoyed the ocean, Irish music, exploring his Irish heritage, and traveling to Ireland.

In addition to his mother, he is survived by two sons, William F. Quinn Jr. of South Yarmouth, and Sean P. Quinn and his wife, Emmajean, of Plymouth; a daughter, Catherine A. Schneider and her husband Tim, of Portsmouth, N.H.; three grandchildren; two brothers, Peter M. Quinn and his wife, Marian, of Vergennes, Vt., and Francis L. "Skip" Quinn and his wife, Sharon, of Leominster; a sister, Margaret M. "Meg" McLoughlin and her husband, William, of East Dennis; and many nieces and nephews.

He was also the brother of the late Catherine A. Quinn.

A funeral will be held at 9 a.m. today, Jan. 5, from the Joseph Dee & Son Funeral Home in Concord, followed by a funeral Mass at 10 a.m., in Holy Family Church. Burial will be in St. Bernard's Cemetery, Concord.
