Minutes

Approval of September 11, 2018 Minutes: Motion to approve September 11, 2018 minutes by Mark Disher, seconded by Frank Carpenter. Minutes approved.

Financial Report

- Grants
 - o January 18, 2019 State Grant in Aid Due
 - County Grant in Aid 6 month report due January 29th
 - January 31, 2019 County Grant in Aid Due
 - Draw funds from 18-19 GIA County
- Audit Submit for request for audit "review" vs full audit will be sent to Commission
 - Innovations has had clean audits for the last two years, the commission has stated that "reviews" would be an option vs full audits for schools in good standing
 - Request sent to Commission awaiting response
 - Looking to set audit dates with Carbonaro follow up January to book for end of July
- Payroll transition to new DOE automated system: all employees have been transitioned to the automated payroll system for pay stubs, W-2 access etc.

Director Report

Financial Updates

- Two Donors' Choose grants written and awarded for robotics equipment for lower elementary grades
- Community organization foundation supporting transportation grants for field trips for all grade levels: admission fees, bus transportation etc.
- Jenn received an email comparison on "per pupil funding charter schools vs DOE public schools" showing that charter schools receive approximately \$3000 less than DOE schools. Will be forwarded to board members.
- Losing two funded state special education positions next year will address in budget planning for next year

Charter School Commission Updates - Sione Thompson (Executive Director)

- Commission proposing a portion of their allocation be used to create a support
 component of the commission to provide administrative support for charter schools the
 separation of the support component from the commission staff will facilitate support
 that is not in conflict with the accountability role of the commission
- Commission staff has been very helpful in advising and supporting efforts to revise academic targets to meet academic framework criteria as well as the admissions policy
- Sione and Commissioner Krug attended charter school meeting for new network in Waimea to support movement

Hawaii Public Charter School Network Update

- Charter schools across the state largest gathering in recent years attended meeting at Waimea charter school to chart course for new charter network.
 - Collective agreement that need for some kind of support network among charters is needed
 - Considering support of multiple charter authorizers to support distinction between authorizer that is the accountability branch to the state and authorizers whose purpose is to support missions of charter schools
 - Reinstituting monthly meetings with DOE to support communication and collaboration
 - Establish bi-lateral contracts process
