GRADING SYSTEM

Olympia High School is on a block schedule. Classes are a semester long and are attended daily with some blended learning options. Students receive a total of 8 credits per year. Grading is based on a Skills Based Grading Scale. Advanced Placement and dual credit courses taken at Olympia High School are given an additional point. Dual enrollment courses taken at Heartland Community College or online are not given additional weight.
