Area	Details
Rules	 Exhibit can be either a performance or an exhibit that shows a member's involvement or interest in the performing arts. To be eligible for State Fair, the member must be able to discuss the process of selecting, planning, performing and reflecting on their project work. If the exhibit is an actual performance, the performance cannot last longer than 5 minutes.
Guidelines	 Although microphones are available, performances should not depend on them Poster exhibits may not exceed 22" wide x 28" high. Three dimensional displays may not exceed 12" deep x 24" wide x 36" high. Exhibits are not limited to three dimensional displays or posters. They may be actual models, games or technology related exhibits. Creativity is encouraged. Resources should be credited and documented for written aspects of the project (e.g., books, websites, 4-H or Extension publications, mentors, magazine articles, etc.).
Exhibit Ideas	 Perform a short story, show scene, music selection, dance, monologue, poetry, etc. An educational display on some aspect of music, drama, dance, or performing A journal or scrapbook (with written statements) of current performing arts experiences A written piece such as poetry, sheet music, or other physical artifact intended for performance created by member
