## 9. **Power over our enemy** – Spiritual Warfare

Whether we realized it or not, the moment we surrendered to Jesus as our Lord we enlisted as soldiers in His army (2 Timothy 2:3-4) and entered into a war. We are in a spiritual battle that will continue as long as we live or Jesus returns. We can be assured, however, that Jesus is victorious over our enemies and has all authority and power over them. Our best defense in this war is to remain close to Jesus and constantly use what He has given us to "be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His might." (Ephesians 6:10). The battle we fight is primarily for the truth we believe.
