

Free Prom Attire for All Genders at April Open Wardrobe

(Philadelphia/Upper Darby) – With a mission of eliminating clothing insecurity for all, The Wardrobe opens its doors this month for youth to access free prom attire.

This month's Open Wardrobe – the nonprofit organization's monthly open event to meet the needs of specific communities – will offer prom attire and accessories for all genders. On Thursday, April 27, from 11 a.m.-6 p.m., participants will receive one free prom attire outfit with accessories while supplies last. If students need access to prom attire before then, they are welcome to make an appointment on The Wardrobe's [website](#) and specify that they need a prom appointment.

Open Wardrobe will be available at both Wardrobe locations: 62 W. Marshall Rd. Upper Darby, PA, and 413 N 4th St. Philadelphia, PA. All participants must RSVP at bit.ly/wardrobprom23.

Supporters can also celebrate spring trends and drop off gently used prom attire at The Wardrobe's bi-monthly Sip, Shop, & Learn event, Thursday, April 20 from 5 p.m.-7 p.m. in Philadelphia and Upper Darby. Each year the nonprofit organization upcycles 200,000+ pounds of gently used and new clothing to provide a stable source of free quality clothing for its participants.
