



2022 NATIONAL JUNIOR OPEN SERIES (NJOS)



FACT SHEET

PURPOSE	To provide a series of meaningful U12, U14, U16 competitive opportunities in ON, QC and BC, leading to the Junior Nationals, and an additional opportunity to gain entry into the Fischer Junior Nationals main draw.
NATIONAL BANK RANKING POINTS	Points will be awarded at either the equivalent of the quarter-finals of Fischer Junior Nationals or 4-Star Events, whichever is higher. Details outlined below for each event.
NJOS #1	July 18-22 Stanley Park Open Stanley Park, Vancouver, BC U12, U14, U16 Singles & First match consolation. Hard courts Entry fee: \$75 National Bank ranking points: equivalent to quarter-finals of Junior Nationals. Entry deadline: July 6 2022 REGISTRATION & INFORMATION PHOTOS
NJOS #2	July 25 - August 1 Bloomex Cup Ottawa Lawn Tennis Club U12, U14, U16 Singles & Doubles, no consolation. Clay courts & hard courts Entry fee: \$80 National Bank ranking points: Girls U12-U16 Bloomex Cup will receive National Bank ranking points equivalent to a 4-Star Event in Ontario. However, the Boys U12-U16 Bloomex Cup will receive the equivalent of QF Junior Nationals points. Entry deadline: July 12 2022 REGISTRATION & INFORMATION *U18 Bloomex Cup is not designated as a National Junior Open Series event and does not allow for entry into the Junior Nationals main draw.
NJOS #3	August 5-7 U12 Quebec Junior Open Carrefour Multisports, Laval, QC Singles and full fee-in consolation. Clay courts (9) Entry fee: \$65 National Bank ranking points: equivalent to quarter-finals of Junior Nationals.

NJOS #5	August 5-8 U16 Quebec Junior Open Le Club De Tennis St Victor, Laval, QC Singles & full feed-in consolation Hard courts (6) Entry fee: \$65 National Bank ranking points: equivalent to quarter-finals of Junior Nationals. Entry deadline: July 27 2022, 4:00 p.m. REGISTRATION & INFORMATION
ELIGIBILITY	The NJOS is part of a three-event qualifying circuit (3 U12 events, 3 U14 and 3 U16), for the Canadian Junior Championships to be held in Canada in July and August. These events, held in British Columbia, Ontario and Quebec, are open to all juniors aged under 12, 14 and 16. In addition to offering players the chance to secure a spot at the Fischer Junior National Championships in August* (in the same age category), each tournament will award ranking points. *Please note that for Quebec players, it is mandatory to have participated in the 2022 Quebec exterior selection circuit in the targeted category in order to be able to participate in the appropriate NJOS tournament and qualify for the qualifying spot at the Canadian Championship (exceptions will be studied by the coaches commission).
ENTRY PROCEDURES	Entries are to be made through each Provincial Tennis Association, at the links provided above indicated <i>Registration & Information</i>
ACCEPTANCE PROCESS	Stanley Park Open: draw size unlimited. Bloomex Cup: entries are capped at 48 per category. Quebec, where the number of courts are limited exceptionally for 2022: • U12 32 entries (32 boys and 32 girls) • U14 42 entries (42 boys and 42 girls) • U16 40 entries (40 boys and 40 girls)
FORMAT	QC (U12, U14, U16 Quebec Junior Open) • Singles draw, with 3rd/4th place play-off matches. • Matches will be the best of 3 tie-break sets and regular scoring.

	• Full feed-in consolation for U12, U14 and U16, 2 out of 3 sets, with no-ad scoring and a 10-point match tie-break in lieu of the 3rd set. ON (Bloomex Cup) • Singles draw, with 3rd/4th place play-off matches. • Matches will be the best of 3 tie-break sets and regular scoring. • Doubles will be a pro set to 8 games, no ad. • No consolation for singles. BC (Stanley Park Open) • Singles draw, with 3rd/4th place play-off matches. • Matches will be the best of 3 tie-break sets and regular scoring. • First round consolation, 2 out of 3 sets, with ad and a 10-point match tie-break in lieu of the 3rd set.
RULES OF THE COURT	All events are run using the Tennis Canada Rules of the Court .
SEEDING	Seeding for all events will be based on the latest National Bank Rankings as of the Tuesday before the draw date.
QUALIFICATION GUIDELINES FOR THE FISCHER JUNIOR NATIONALS	Each NJOS event will award one spot in the U12, U14 and U16 age categories, both for the boys and the girls, for the Fischer Junior Nationals Championships. These will be determined as follows: 1. The champion of each National Junior Open Series event automatically receives a spot in that age division. 2. If the champion is ineligible (i.e.-has already qualified for a spot through the Provincial Qualifying Process, foreign player) then the spot will go to the next eligible player up to and including the 4th place finisher. For example, if the champion is ineligible then the finalist receives the spot. If the finalist is ineligible, then the spot goes to the 3rd place finisher followed by the 4th place finisher if required.
OFFICIALS	Tennis Canada certified Referees, Roving and Chair umpires will be at each tournament. The draw will be conducted by the Tournament Referee.
ACCOMMODATION	Tournament hotels will be advertised in each event Fact Sheet, which are available on the <i>Registration & Information</i> links above. Players may reserve their own rooms directly with these hotels.
PRACTICE COURTS	The amount and timing of practice courts available at each tournament will vary. Please contact the individual tournaments for information.
TRAVEL	All travel needs are the responsibility of each player. Please note that a special rate for car rental from from AVIS has been negotiated, which can be accessed here: AVIS
