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School & Community: John P. Stevens High School (JPS), built in 1964, is a comprehensive four year high school situated in residential North Edison. It consistently ranks as one of the best public high schools in New Jersey. JPS has an outstanding co-curricular program, encompassing athletics, drama, student government, music, the fine arts, and several volunteer and service organizations. Edison is a 32 square mile township in northern Middlesex County, just north of New Brunswick and Rutgers University, and 25 miles southwest of New York City. It is a diverse community with students from dozens of different countries. The average class size is approximately 25. The faculty consists of approximately 185 teachers, with ~ 60% of whom have Masters, 1% of whom have Doctorates. There are five administrators, ten school counselors, two college counselors, PATH Counselors, and a special services team. John P. Stevens High School is accredited by the New Jersey Department of Ed.

The three major levels of grouping are: Advanced Placement (AP) or Honors (H), Accelerated (1) and Academic (2). Dual Credit Courses (DCC) are designated on the transcript. All students in these courses are eligible to earn college credit through Middlesex College, but not all students chose to apply for those credits. Calculus 3H is the highest level math.

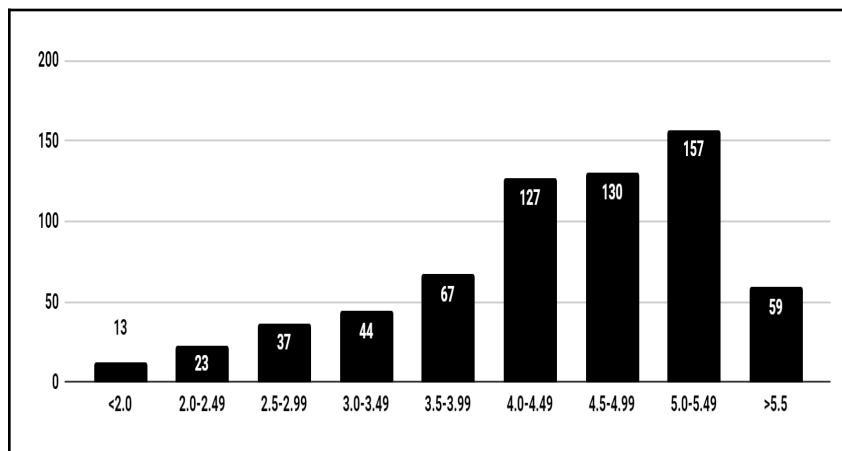

A GPA is computed at the end of each year. Valedictorian/ Salutatorian are based on quality points. Courses taken in the high school during the regular school year are included in the weighted GPA. A quality point value is assigned to each letter grade and then is multiplied by the number of credits for each course. The sum is divided by the number of credits. Weighted and unweighted GPAs are reported on the transcript. 6.05 is approximately the highest GPA that can be attained.

Students who have taken all high school courses in Edison and/or other high schools in New Jersey (public/parochial/ private) receive a weighted GPA and are included in the GPA Distribution Chart. Students from outside New Jersey who transfer to Edison following their first marking period of the junior year are not included. The transcript includes information pertaining to classes taken at the previous high school(s) at the time of transfer. Grades from out of the country are entered as Pass/Fail. Students must earn 130 credits to graduate.
