

November Campaign 2024 Families Complete List

Tulkarem City and Tulkarem Camp

1. Divorced women with seven members in her household, asthmatic and has a chronic illness. The army forced the family from their home, and damaged it so that it is unlivable.
2. A 65 year old woman who lives with her brothers, she is disabled. The army destroyed their house after raiding. She said, “with my disability, I carried with me what I could.” Since that time, they’ve not been able to make repairs.
3. A 58 year-old widow, 4 in her household. The army stormed her home, and blew out all the windows, they haven’t been able to properly cover the windows. She reported wide-spread destruction in her neighborhood.
4. Mother of injured 17-year-old boy. He was shot in the back and seriously wounded. The doctors removed bullets and metal fragments from his back and he was put in a wheelchair. A month later, he was injured again, with more severe injuries. He requires constant care and his mother is his caregiver.
5. Widowed mother of six, three sons and three daughters. One of her sons, 22, was killed. The army stormed their home and burned it down. They are displaced and homeless.
6. Mother whose son, 28, was killed, her son left an orphaned daughter. There are six in the household.
7. Mother whose son, 35, was killed. There are three members in the household. House was damaged, furniture destroyed, rainwater leaks from the roof. They do not have the money to make repairs.
8. Family whose house was destroyed when a missile hit next to them.

9. Widowed mother of four, two girls and two boys. There are fifteen members in their household. After their neighborhood was bombarded multiple times, they were forced to flee like many others and are now displaced.
10. Mother whose son was killed in an airstrike in October 2024 . His cause of death was head injury from shrapnel.
11. A victim of the cafe airstrike in Oct. 2024, a 66-year-old woman who remains in hospital due to injuries from the airstrike. Fragments of shrapnel remain in her body and she needs surgery.
12. Another victim of the cafe airstrike, a 43-year-old woman, suffered from shrapnel wounds.
13. Following airstrikes, six parts of the family were left homeless and forced to find a rented place to stay. They lost four family members in an airstrike in Oct. 2024, adding to their devastation. The mother expressed that if they need to buy something, they have to find a way to make it work. They lost all their clothes in the strikes and can't afford to buy winter clothing.
14. Mother who was affected by the cafe airstrike in Oct. 2024.
15. Mother of four children, house was damaged during raids, walls, windows and front door need repairs.
16. Mother whose seventeen-year-old son was killed in a strike.
17. Divorced mother of six, two girls and four boys, with no family support.
18. Mother whose son, 24, was killed in 2023. He died of shrapnel injuries in the abdomen in hospital after being injured in a strike.

19. Widow with five children, whose house was destroyed in an airstrike. They are staying at a relative's house. The airstrikes had damaged her daughter's hearing.
20. A mother who suffered through two airstrikes, the second one she was in the house at the time, but miraculously was unharmed. There are six people in her household.
21. A mother with cancer who has four children. Her house and her brother's house were damaged by raids.
22. A mother with three children. The army came into their home, ransacked it and traumatized the children with dogs and weapons. Their neighbor's house was hit in an airstrike.
23. Mother and widow of three children, two boys and one girl. Her husband was killed by an airstrike right outside of their house. The children were there at the time. In March 2024, the army raided the house, harassed the children, destroyed their belongings and stole cash.
24. A mother of three whose husband has disabilities and is mute. He was severely beaten by soldiers. She is the main caregiver and breadwinner and responsible for the family. The soldiers damaged their home, turned everything over and stole cash. They can't secure the front door.
25. Mother whose husband is not independent.
26. Family whose house was bulldozed while they were in it, and bombarded with artillery fire. They lost everything and are displaced.
27. Widower whose wife and eldest son died in an accident. His other son was also injured. He has three other children, two are married.
28. Woman who was affected by airstrikes. She was not able to speak with us.

29. Mother of four whose son was killed. Their house was destroyed.
30. Mother whose son was killed two months prior to our meeting. Her husband is sick. She also has a three-year-old son. There are nine people in their household, and their house has been destroyed.
31. Mother of three boys, and two girls. Her son, 17, was killed in January 2024. Her daughter is sick. Due to damage from raids, they do not have any electricity. The army enters their home often and harasses them. Her husband is laid off due to the economic crisis and suffers from back pain.
32. Mother with diabetes who has three boys, and two girls. Her eldest, 37, was killed in November 2024. His brother was with him when he was killed. Two of her daughters have special needs, and one needs surgery next week. The mother was exasperated in how she would manage everything.
33. Young women whose mother died. Six people in her household. Their house is next to the camp, so they are often harassed by soldiers and their house is damaged by fighting. Some family members have been injured during raids.
34. Mother of three. Her eldest son, 30, was killed when the house was destroyed with him inside in July 2024.
35. Mother with cancer whose son, 26, was killed in July 2024. They have no house due to airstrikes.
36. Grandmother whose house was destroyed by airstrikes. She is sick.
37. Mother whose son was killed. Soldiers enter their home often, put them in one room, and occupy it. All their windows are blown out and much of the interior of the house is damaged.

38. Mother whose son was killed in November 2023. Airstrike in the neighborhood that hit the day before our visit was right next to her home.
39. Mother whose son was killed in November 2023. After the death, the soldiers harassed the family and turned their house upside down damaging the interior.
40. Mother whose husband died in 2023, her son was killed two months after her husband's death.
41. Mother of five children, her son was killed in November 2023.
42. Widowed mother with five in their household. All windows shattered and damage to the front door. No money for repairs.
43. Family with eleven members in the household. Broken windows, doors and damage to the roof. No money for repairs.
44. Family with six members in the household. Broken windows, and doors. No money for repairs.

Wa'ad also gave assistance in September to two extended families whose houses were destroyed in airstrikes in July 2023. Members of this family were receiving specialized care in Nablus for severe burns from the strikes. The families were displaced and lost their belongings and were in need of support.

Nur Al Shams Camp (Tulkarem)

1. Mother with five children. At 2am, soldiers bulldozed their rented home, and damaged it severely. Some of the family were injured. Everyone is unemployed due to the economic crisis. No family support.
2. Widowed mother with three young children. Her husband was killed in 2023 before Oct. 7th. Five family members were killed in front of the children.
3. Widowed mother with three young children. Her husband was killed in 2023. Soldiers enter the house often and harass the children.
4. Mother with four children. Her son was killed in April 2024. Her daughter was also killed, she left an orphaned daughter.
5. Widowed mother whose husband was killed 2023 in an airstrike. The soldiers enter her house often, harass them, destroy and steal their belongings. All the windows and doors are broken.
6. Mother with three boys and two girls. During the invasion in Aug-Oct 2023, soldiers occupied their home for more than forty hours. Husband lost his job on Oct. 7th. 2023.
7. Mother with three boys. Nine people in the household. Neighbor's house was bombed. Soldiers enter their home often, harass the family and destroy things. Her daughter is in university with no housing.
8. Mother with two girls and one boy. One of her daughters is divorced. Her husband was laid off after Oct. 7th. They are displaced as their home has been destroyed.
9. Mother with six children. She reported that the soldiers enter her home every couple of days, hold them hostage, harass the children and humiliate them. They have no respect for their home, damage the interior and demand things from them.

10. Mother whose son was killed in February 2024 in an airstrike. Her other son is a prisoner. Her daughter, 27, is sick. They are displaced and afraid to go back to their house. Six in the household.
11. Divorced woman with four sons. Her ex-husband is in Jordan. No family support. Their house was hit in a strike, completely destroyed and she was injured. They are displaced.
12. Woman whose husband was killed fourteen days prior to our meeting (Oct. 2023). Her brother was also killed. Their house was bombed and heavily damaged (no stairs).
13. Widowed mother with five children. Her husband died in 2022. Her youngest is three-years-old. Their house has been damaged by the raids.
14. Mother of six, eight people in their household. Her son was killed in April 2024. Windows blown in and doors damaged. Her daughters have been traumatized and suffer from psychological problems.
15. Four in the household. Soldiers raided their house in January and August 2024, each time they destroyed the interior, blew out doors and windows and stole cash and valuables. Sister's family's situation is also bad.
16. Seven people in the household. House was bombed and damaged with all their belongings inside. The son was injured. Husband unemployed since Oct. 7th.
17. Eleven people in the household. Young children in the house. House was destroyed and they are forced to rent. Husband is unemployed. The situation is impossible.
18. Family with six in their household whose house has been destroyed. One family member is in prison. Another family member is special needs.

19. Family with five in their household. Home heavily damaged during raids. Husband is unemployed due to the economic crisis.

20. Family with five in their household. Husband was laid off after Oct. 7th. House is damaged.

Nablus

Seventeen Gazan women. Six women who had been in hospital on Oct. 7th in Nablus because they had received IVF and had high-risk pregnancies. They all had twins. Several Gazan women who had been in hospital in Jenin on Oct. 7th for cancer treatment. A woman from Gaza living in Jericho, whose family in Gaza had lost everything.

Refugee Camps (Ain, Askar and Balata Camp)

1. Widow and mother of five children. One of her children has a long-term injury and requires care. She herself has a health condition that has reduced her mobility. She has no family support and their house is small and in bad shape.
2. A mother with four children. One of her sons was killed. Her husband is elderly, suffers from a chronic illness that requires ongoing treatment and cannot work. They live in an old and deteriorated house that belongs to her husband's family.
3. A mother with four children. One of her sons was killed. Her other children suffer from vision issues and are special needs. Her husband is unemployed due to the economic crisis. Their house is in poor condition.
4. Mother of eight children, one of whom is special needs. Her husband is imprisoned. The daughter requires full-time care. The husband worked previously as a janitor. Their economic situation is very bad.

5. Mother whose son was killed. Before his death, the soldiers came into her home, beat her until all the bones were broken in her chest, and trashed their house, destroying furniture and their belongings. The army routinely enters their home and harasses them. Husband is formally imprisoned, and now works as a civil servant, but since the war started, his salary has been slashed. She works part-time in the local school but it is not enough to support the family.
6. Widow with 3 boys, and two girls (one son was killed). The two girls have been married since the war started. Her husband was killed by the Israelis. Since her son's murder, the army has entered their home six times, trashing the house and harassing their family. She is not originally from the camp and does not have outside family support. She comes from modest means. She described her son as really kind and smart. As we talked to her she broke down in tears: "My mother, my brother, my husband, all dead, and my son, he was the last."
7. Divorced mother of 5 girls, and one son who was killed. They lived in rented accommodation. The father does not support them. They can't even afford mattresses or basic furnishings. They struggle to afford clothing, especially in winter. She expressed her frustration at the situation. When her son was killed by the Israelis, his body was disfigured. She described her son as strong, proud, charismatic, reliable and protective of the family. She missed him a lot.
8. Widow with six children. Husband was killed. They live in a rented two-room apartment. No family support.
9. Divorced woman with six children, 5 girls and one boy. No family support.
10. Widow whose husband was killed and mother of four children. She lives with her husband's family in the same house. The house is in poor condition and their financial situation is extremely difficult.
11. Mother with two sons who were killed and two sons who are in prison. She is facing severe financial hardship and is living in an unlivable dilapidated apartment with no proper ventilation.
12. Widow and mother of four children. Her husband was killed. There is no provider for the family and she has no family support. Living conditions are tough and their house is in bad condition.

13. Widow and mother of two children. Her husband was killed. She lives with her family in one room. The furniture is damaged and the house is in poor condition.
14. Widow and mother with five children. Her husband was killed and they have no family support. They live in a rented apartment in poor condition.
15. Widow and mother of one child. Her husband was killed. She lives in her family's home but their economic situation is very difficult.
16. Mother of six children whose son was killed. They live in a very small house inside the camp in poor condition. Her husband is unemployed due to the economic crisis.
17. A mother with five children. One of her sons was killed. Her husband has been unemployed since Oct. 7th. The economic situation is difficult and they live in cramped, worn-out accommodation.

Nablus City:

18. Mother of three girls and two boys. One of her sons has diabetes. Another son is handicapped. Husband is imprisoned by the Israelis, his car confiscated. He is in prison under administrative detention with no charge. They keep extending every three months. Older daughter is in university but they are unable to pay her tuition. The family lives with sister-in-laws family (widow, three children). They (10 people) share a two bedroom rented apartment, with one small kitchen and sitting room.
19. Mother with three children. Her son was killed. Their house is in poor condition and the furniture is damaged. They rent. Her husband is unemployed due to the economic crisis.
20. Mother of four children whose husband is imprisoned. She lives in her husband's family's small home. It is in poor condition and their economic situation is very bad.
21. Widow and mother of seven children. Her husband was killed. She lives in rented housing that is basic and dilapidated. Their economic situation is dire.

22. Mother with six children. Her husband was killed. They live in a rented apartment in poor condition and she has had no support since her husband's death.
23. Mother with four children. Her husband was killed. They are in a bad financial situation and she has no support.
24. Mother with five children. Her eldest son is imprisoned. Her youngest son was bitten and injured by an occupation dog and requires surgery.
25. Mother with four children. Her eldest son was killed. He was nineteen.
26. Divorced mother of six children. One of her sons was killed. She is recently divorced and does not have support.
27. Mother with three children. Her husband was killed. She has no support.
28. Woman in Nablus with family in Gaza who lost their home and were displaced.

Jenin (these families were helped in **September** when the city was under siege).

Three patients who were receiving critical treatments at Jenin Governmental Hospital. During the Israeli invasion Aug-Oct. of the Northern West Bank, the hospital came under siege and the electricity was cut off. Many patient's treatments were transferred to hospitals in Nablus, one hour south and difficult to travel to due to checkpoints and closures. This has burdened families already struggling to get by with added expenses such as travel, accommodation and additional medical expenses, not to mention added stress.

1. 57-year-old woman from Jenin who has bone cancer, and is undergoing chemo treatment at the Jenin Governmental Hospital.
2. A 36-year-old woman from Sanur near Jenin who suffers from kidney failure. Her survival depends on dialysis treatments three times a week at the Jenin Governmental Hospital.

3. 62-year-old cancer patient from Jenin receiving chemo treatment at Jenin Governmental Hospital.

Other cases:

1. A mother and widow with four children. Her husband was killed, and her two eldest sons were severely injured. They were forcibly displaced from their home, and are prevented from returning. She sought shelter, basic necessities and medical care for her injured sons.
2. A family whose home was demolished. They were not given time to remove their belongings and could only take what they could carry. They are homeless and are in need of shelter and basic necessities.
3. A young man and his cousin from Jenin who had a modest farming project with a greenhouse. During the invasion of Jenin, their farm was set on fire and they were trapped in the greenhouse. They both received second and first-degree burns on their faces, legs and arms and they also suffered from gas inhalation. They were in intensive care for three weeks. One of the young men has a wife and young daughter and his cousin is a university student.

Far'a Camp:

Fifteen families who had imprisoned family members, killed family members (many of them children) and several families from low socio-economic backgrounds with no support who were struggling to pay their children's university fees.

One family's home was destroyed in an airstrike. Two members of the family were killed, and two others injured by shrapnel—one seriously.

Another family had recently lost their son to the Israeli forces and were still recovering from the loss. They showed our volunteers the son's framed photo and one of the volunteers commented on how warm his smile was. The mother hugged the photo and started to cry. His sister also started to cry. The grief was very present in the room and there were lots of hugs and tears.

There was a mother with two disabled children whose husband was imprisoned. She had no one to support her. They lived in their family's small home in the camp.

Volunteers also visited a family whose entire street-facing walls had been blown in; the family had been forced to take refuge in the small kitchen, the room farthest away from the street, during the siege in August 2024.

Qalandia Camp and Kfar Aqab

1. Mother with two boys, and two girls. At 2am on Jan.11th 2023, the soldiers came to arrest her eldest son. They put the family in one room, took photos, and demanded the whereabouts of their son in an aggressive manner. The father resisted them taking his son, trying to protect him, and he was shot in the chest by the soldiers. His widow described holding him as he bled out, the blood seeping into her pajamas, for about 10-15 minutes waiting for the ambulance to be allowed to reach them. She said it was an hour from the shooting to getting to the hospital, where he was pronounced dead. Her other son was in prison and didn't know about the death until he was released. It has severely affected his mental health.
2. Mother with a son who is imprisoned and a son with special needs. Her husband is unemployed due to the economic crisis. What they earn here and there, all goes to the lawyer trying to fight for the release of their son. They live in very basic accommodation, there is no kitchen in the apartment, it is outside. She said the lawyer Israel assigns is 500 shekels a month (\$130), but if you want a specialized lawyer that will give you a higher chance of release it is 13-20k NIS (\$3,500-\$5,500).
3. Mother whose son was killed in July 2024. He was nineteen. There are five in the household. The army raided the camp and he was shot on their roof by snipers. They hit two internal organs and he didn't make it to the hospital.
4. Mother of three. Her youngest son, 14, is a prisoner. He was taken by undercover agents from the school bus on his way home from school. The mother is fighting for his release, but the lawyer fees are high. The last word she got about his condition was that he was suffering from scabies. Update: His health seems to be doing better.
5. Mother whose son was killed. He was a journalist, and was filming clashes when he was shot by a sniper. He was shot through his eye through the back of his head. She has other children. Her husband is unemployed due to the economic crisis. One of her daughters is studying interior design at Bir Zeit but the family can't pay the university fees.
6. Family who was affected by the killing of a nephew in the family. The death came as a surprise. The entire family's houses were demolished, leaving them homeless.
7. Divorced mother with three boys and two girls. All three sons were in prison—one has been released. They release them and then arrest them again. During one of son's arrests, an army attack dog bit off his hand. He has not recovered and needs surgery. The released son described the conditions in prison: they give a little bowl of rice for an entire cell of men and they have to ration amongst themselves, they give them scraps of old, hard bread and they have to soak it in water to be able to eat it. They are tortured.

8. Family with four boys, and two girls. Two of the sons are imprisoned. One son, 29, was released the day before our meeting. He was released directly to the hospital with clear signs of torture—head injury, blood loss, and a broken leg. He also lost 16 kilos. He was talking very little in a state of shock. He has four children, and one child with down syndrome. Another son, 24, has been imprisoned for one year and four months. The last time the lawyer saw him he had injuries and was suffering from tooth problems.
9. Family whose house was bombed and raided in May 2024. One family member was killed. Two other family members were imprisoned under “suspicion” with no charge. Everything is broken in the house, there are no windows or doors.
10. Mother with three imprisoned sons and one who has been killed. Her 25-year-old son has been in prison for 2 years. Her 27-year-old son, one-year, and her 22-year-old son, 10-months. She was able to visit them before Oct. 7th, but since Oct. 7th there has been nothing. No news since mid-September 2023. She also has a six-year-old son.

Jerusalem

Abu Dis

1. A mother whose son was killed and her husband was imprisoned. There are six in the household.

Shuafat Camp

2. A mother whose son was killed. Their house was demolished, and they are displaced. There are five in the household.
3. A mother whose husband was killed. She is the sole provider and has no support. There are five in the household.

Jabal Al-Makbr

1. Displaced due to residency issues. Bad economic situation due to the crisis and discriminatory occupation policies towards Palestinian residents of Jerusalem. Six in the household.
2. Displaced due to residency issues. Bad economic situation due to the crisis and discriminatory occupation policies towards Palestinian residents of Jerusalem. Four in the household.

Silwan

1. Mother with son who is imprisoned and has special needs. Four in the household.

2. Family whose house was partially demolished by the occupation and is at risk of complete demolition.
3. Family in the Al-Bustan neighborhood whose house was demolished. They are displaced.
