## Story Prework Resourcing Networks for Equity | Oct 2019

In advance of the gathering, please take 30 minutes to complete the following pre-work activity and reading.

## 1. Prepare a 3 min story related to one of these questions:

- How have funders and other organizations worked together in networks that promote equity and systems change?
- What are the barriers to resourcing networks for equitable systems change?
- What is the personal work and way of being needed to fully engage in networks, equity and systems change?

If you need more inspiration, consider these questions

- What are examples of the "code switching" or reframing work that I am doing to resource networked/emergent/organic work that challenges power dynamics?
- What are examples of institutional and org cultural challenges I face? What are my workarounds (e.g. due diligence, proposals, reporting, evaluation)?
- What are new ways of doing/being that I'm trying out within and outside my organization/foundation that could transform how funding flows into networks?

You can write this story up, outline it, jot down a few notes, consider a soundtrack for it, visualize it, etc.. We will be referencing and sharing these stories multiple times at the convening so please prepare a story that you're ok with sharing. Also brevity sometimes means clarity, please be able to tell your story in 3 minutes. It's ok if you struggle to weave your story. We encourage you to lean into imperfection! Most importantly, this is your personal story to tell.

## Some Compelling Storytelling Parameters

- 1. Draws on your real past and lessons you've learned from it (feelings, the space etc)
- 2. Resonates emotionally with your audience because it's relevant to them.
- 3. Inspires your audience because it's fueled by your passion.
- 4. Shows the struggle between your goal and the obstacles you faced in pursuing it.
- 5. Illustrates with a vivid example.
- 6. Teaches an important lesson.
