<b>Title</b>	A free text name given to the resource. If the resource lacks a title, use a summarized description of the item.		
<b>Creator</b>	Creator of the resource. If the creator is not clear, list the agency that funded or housed the original resource.	Last name, First name Initials (if name(s) unknown)	Hansberry, Lorraine Hansberry, L L.H
<b>Date Created</b>	Date that the resource was created. Use <a href="#">ISO 8601</a> format. If the date created is not available, use the copyright date or date the original resource was added to the holding institution.	YYYY YYYY-YYYY YYYY-MM YYYY-MM-DD	2023 2021-2023 2023-11 2023-11-28
<b>Description</b>	A free text description of the resource. Description should provide more detail than given in the resource title. Avoid descriptions that give “interpretation” of the resource. State the facts.		
<b>Subjects</b>	Subject headings or keywords that describe the resource. These should reflect key aspects and persons involved or mentioned in the resource. Use Library of Congress Subject Headings.	Use Library of Congress Subject Headings.	
<b>Location</b>	Location the resource was created at. If this information is not available use the location of the creator or creating institution.	City, State State Country	Birmingham, Alabama Alabama United States
<b>Latitude</b>	Latitude of the location		33.5186
<b>Longitude</b>	Longitude of the location		-86.8104
<b>Source</b>	Provide the name of the repository where this resource was found, the name of the individual who put the collection together (if available) and a URL to that repository.	Use “Courtesy of <i>repository</i> (insert resource link)”	
<b>Source Identifier</b>	Unique identifier given to the resource.	Initials of related literature _ # of resource	fnt_2
<b>Type</b>	The genre of the resource. Uses <a href="#">DCMI Type Vocabulary</a>	Use the <a href="#">DCMI Type Vocabulary</a>	Image;StillImage

<b>Format</b>	The physical medium of the resource. Uses <a href="#">IANA Vocabulary</a> .	Use <a href="#">IANA Vocabulary</a> in the following manner: category/sub-category	application/pdf video/mp4
<b>Rights</b>	Describe what these resources are being used for.	Use "Educational Use"
