## Storyboard Template for iMovie

NARRATIVE- What am I hearing?	VISUAL- What am I seeing?
<p>Scene 1: Title</p> <p>Song playing softly in background.</p>	<p>Title of the presentation</p> <p>There will be a slide with text on it that reads: "Conjugation of the verb "ir" in the present tense"</p>
<p>Scene 2: Introduction to topic</p> <p>"Ir" means 'to go.' We use the verb to talk about places we <i>will</i> go or things we <i>will</i> do in the future. "Ir" is an irregular verb when it is conjugated in the present tense. This means that it does not follow the pattern that we talked about last class for present tense verbs ending in -ir. It has its own conjugation in the present tense."</p>	<p>You will see me, sitting at a desk talking about the verb "ir." I will use a whiteboard to display the verb and translation. I will include a basic drawing of the action "to go" with the translation.</p>
<p>Scene 3: Conjugations</p> <p>"To conjugate the verb 'ir' we still need to pay attention to the subject of the verb. The subjects are yo, tú, él/ella/usted, nosotros/as, vosotros/as, ellos/ellas/ustedes. The present conjugations of 'ir' are yo <b>voy</b>, tú <b>vas</b>, él/ella/usted <b>va</b>, nosotros/as <b>vamos</b>, vosotros/as <b>váis</b>, ellos/ellas/ustedes <b>van</b>."</p>	<p>You will see me with a whiteboard writing the subjects with their proper present tense conjugations down as I read them aloud.</p>

<p>Scene 4: Takeaway and Application</p> <p>“So, now that we know how to conjugate ‘ir’ in the present tense, we must consider why the verb is important and why we are learning about it. We will use this in the ir+a+infinitive formula to talk about things that we are going to do in the future. This formula is an easy and effective way to talk about the future, using present tense conjugation that we are familiar with. Let’s see how this looks.”</p>	<p>You will see me, sitting at my desk explaining why the verb “ir” is important and how we will apply it to the lesson.</p>
<p>Scene 5: Examples and Closure</p> <p>“Let’s make some basic sentences using the present tense conjugation of ‘ir.’ Please follow along with me and write down these examples in your notebook. How would I say ‘I am going to Spain next week?’ → ‘Yo voy a España la próxima semana.’ See look how easy this is! How about if I want to say ‘My sister is going to buy a new dress’ → ‘Mi hermana va a comprar un nuevo vestido’ Notice that the only verb we have to conjugate is ‘ir,’ the other verbs in the sentence remain in the infinitive form. Let’s do one more example. How would I say ‘My friend and I are going to do the homework after school.’ → ‘Mi amigo y yo vamos a hacer la tarea antes de escuela.’ Great job everyone! Now we can use ‘ir’ conjugated in the present tense to talk about our plans for the future.”</p> <p>Applause playing softly in background to congratulate students for trying the examples.</p>	<p>You will see me holding up images of the activity I am explaining in each example. I will write down the sentence that matches the image on the whiteboard. When we finish one example, I will erase the board, take out the new picture, and write the corresponding sentence with it. I will continue this until all examples have been reviewed. I will then sit at my desk and conclude the video.</p> <p>Slide that reads “Gracias!” to conclude the video.</p>
