Target Standards	Students will engage in the writing and research processes to compose academic texts. Students will analyze, synthesize, and evaluate a variety of print and electronic texts. Students will analyze and critique their own writing and peer writing. Students will integrate evidence to support their own ideas, using quoting, paraphrasing, and summarizing.		
Learning Goal	 Compile resources for your Research-Based Place Essay. Evaluate the effectiveness of each source and explain the information that you can apply to your essay draft. Apply the writing process to move from the prewriting step to creating a complete rough draft based on the writing guidelines. Correctly cite each source using MLA format as you would for a Works Cited page. Utilize the Rough Draft Checklist as an additional guideline for developing effective introduction, body, and conclusion paragraphs and completing your rough draft. Apply basic writing conventions with attention to punctuation, subject-verb agreement, sentence structure (watch for fragments and run-ons), capitalization, spelling, and grammar. 		
Essential Questions	How will you utilize sources, including database sources, to generate information for your Research-Based Place Essay? How will you organize the information from your sources into a comprehensive rough draft? Who can you share your rough draft with to peer edit? What do you from me to help facilitate peer editing?		
Learning Activity	Using the writing process, apply the information from your research into a comprehensive rough draft with a clear introduction and thesis		

	statement, body paragraphs that correctly use in-text citation, and a conclusion paragraph. Review your rough draft checklist as a guideline for completing the rough draft successfully.
