

EXPLANATION OF THE TRANSCRIPT GRADING SYSTEM

For subjects evaluated through both assessments and graded scores, the *semester average subject score* (ĐTBm_{hk}) determines students' academic results for each semester, while the *yearly average subject score* (ĐTBm_{cn}) evaluates their academic performance for the entire school year. Student performance is classified into one of four levels: Excellent, Good, Pass, or Fail.

a) Excellent

- All subjects evaluated solely through assessment are rated “Pass”.
- For subjects evaluated through both assessment and grading, the student's average score (ĐTBm_{hk}, ĐTBm_{cn}) is at least 6.5, and at least six subjects have an average score of 8.0 or higher.

b) Good

- All subjects evaluated solely through assessment are rated “Pass”.
- For subjects evaluated through both assessment and grading, the average score (ĐTBm_{hk}, ĐTBm_{cn}) is at least 5.0, and at least six subjects have an average score of 6.5 or higher.

c) Pass

- No more than one subject evaluated solely through assessment is rated as “Fail”.
- At least six subjects evaluated through both assessment and grading have an average score (ĐTBm_{hk}, ĐTBm_{cn}) of 5.0 or higher, with no subject having an average score below 3.5.

d) Fail

- Any remaining cases that do not meet the above criteria.
