1. <input type="checkbox"/> Coalition (koh-ah-li-shun)	A. Members of Parliament who understand procedure and how to debate issues.
2. <input type="checkbox"/> Parliament (par-li-ah-muhnt)	B. A member of a parliamentary Cabinet who introduces Bills in the House of Parliament on behalf of the government.
3. <input type="checkbox"/> Parliamentarians (par-li-ah-muhnt-eh-ree-uns))	C. This is where members of the opposition parties hold the government in check by questioning the Prime Minister and Cabinet Ministers on their actions and decisions.
4. <input type="checkbox"/> Head of State (hed-ov-stayt)	D. When two or more political parties agree to cooperate to form a government.
5. <input type="checkbox"/> Bill (bil)	E. The committee of senior government ministers responsible for controlling government policy such as spending, new services, programs, policies and ideas for new laws.
6. <input type="checkbox"/> Cabinet (kab-ih-net)	F. The chief public representative of the country. In Canada that is the monarch of the UK.
7. <input type="checkbox"/> Cabinet Ministers (kab-ih-net min-ih-sturs)	G. A legislative body of government that represents the people, makes laws, and oversees what the government is doing.
8. <input type="checkbox"/> House of Commons (howz ov com-unz)	H. A proposed statute (law) that has not yet been approved
